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SECTION I: DESCRIPTION OF UNIT

The Department of Educational and Counselling Psychology (ECP) is a scholarly and professional community whose mandate is to advance scientific knowledge and practice in education and psychology from both a research perspective that advances theories in this field as well as an applied perspective that informs practice in the community. Strong interdisciplinary partnerships exist in this department that extend internationally. Our research and teaching themes fall under an umbrella of: Learning, cognition and development in typical and atypical populations across the lifespan. Within this theme we have 3 research areas:

- 1. Assessment and intervention
- 2. Cognitive processes and developmental neuroscience; and
- 3. Design and evaluation of learning environments and instructional practices.

The department serves graduate instruction primarily. It offers 1 Post Ph. D. Graduate Diploma, 3 Ph. D. programs, 2 M.A. programs with thesis options, one M. A. non-thesis, and an M. Ed. (non thesis) program. Two of the Ph.D. programs are accredited. The Ph.D. program in Counselling Psychology has received accreditation from the Canadian and American Psychological Associations (CPA/APA) as well as the Ordre des Psychology has received APA accreditation as well as accreditation from the OPQ. ECP also has offerings at the undergraduate level for B.Ed. students in inclusive education and a minor in the BA program. Certificate and diploma programs exist as well. Brief descriptions of major programs are provided below.

A) Programs:

• Post Ph. D. Graduate Diploma in School/Applied Child Psychology

This graduate diploma enables holders of a doctorate in Psychology to re-specialize in School/ Applied Child Psychology, and is adapted to the background of each student.

• M.A. and Ph.D. in School/Applied Child Psychology (accredited)

This integrated MA and PhD program combines theoretical, research, and clinical experiences. It is built on the Scientist-Practitioner (Boulder) model and prepares graduates for the practice of professional psychology and academic occupations. The goal is to develop competent and inquiring professionals who have the skills to improve the educational and psychological well-being of children, to use research to critically inform practice, and to be able to conceptualize and conduct applied and theoretical research arising from practice and the science of psychology, especially as it relates to issues in education.

• Ph. D. in Counselling Psychology (accredited)

Graduates of this program are prepared to assume careers in education and community settings, including faculty positions, counselling and psychological positions on the staff in universities and college mental health centres, and professional positions in psychological agencies offering preventative mental health services.

Ph. D. in Educational Psychology

Students of this program acquire competencies in planning and implementing basic and applied research and developing and evaluating educational programs in various contexts. The Ph. D. is offered in several specializations including Applied Cognitive Psychology, Special Populations, Applied Developmental Psychology, and Instructional Psychology. Graduates typically pursue academic careers and professional positions such as researchers in academic, government, industry and medical settings, instructional designers, and consultants in educational matters.

• M.A. in Counselling Psychology (Thesis Option)

The aim of this program is to prepare graduates for research and teaching in the field of counselling psychology and to give them the foundation for doctoral studies that place emphasis on research.

• M.A. in Counselling Psychology (Non-Thesis Option)

The aim of this program is to produce graduates who are trained in the major areas of Counselling Psychology, are qualified to be counsellors in a variety of settings, have a knowledge of counselling in both the academic and applied aspects, and who have an extensive supervised internship.

• M.A. in Educational Psychology (Thesis Option)

Students of this program acquire competencies in a range of educational psychology specializations including Applied Cognitive Psychology, Applied Developmental Psychology, Health Sciences, Special Populations, Instructional Psychology, and School/Applied Child Psychology.

M.Ed. in Educational Psychology

This program offers the opportunity to professionals to obtain advanced training in areas where psychology can make a practical contribution. These areas include General Educational Psychology, Inclusive Education, Family Life Education, and the Learning Sciences.

B) Objectives 2006-2007

- 1. The Department of Educational and Counselling Psychology interviewed for and filled three faculty positions in 2006. The new assistant faculty members include:
 - Professor **Panayiota Kendeou** joins us as the new Learning Sciences hire (formerly Cognition and Instruction). She recently completed her post-doctoral training at the University of Minnesota, where she was awarded a Ph.D. in May 2005. Her research interests focus on language and memory, cognitive processes in learning, reading comprehension, mental models, conceptual change in learning, and instructional interventions.
 - Professor **Tara Flanagan** joins the Special Populations of Learners / Inclusive Education program. She has three research themes, wellness research and resilience in Aboriginal youth; transitional lifelong learning goals of individuals with developmental disabilities who are transitioning into the community with a focus on increasing social inclusion; autism, attention and social cognition. She is a graduate of this department.
 - Professor **Krista Muis** was hired into the Educational Assessment position. She had formerly been working as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Educational Psychology at the University of Nevada – Las Vegas, and earned her doctoral degree in 2004 from Simon Fraser University. Her area of research is students' epistemic beliefs, motivation, self-regulation, explored in the context of mathematics learning.
- 2. The ECP administrative office went through many transitions this year. We hired a new Administrative Officer, Samantha Ryan, who has been instrumental in putting new procedures into place that have helped facilitate the financial management of the department. Our Undergraduate Program Coordinator, Barbara Koester, retired and was replaced by Dean Thomson, our former secretary. In the interim, we have had a casual employee filling the secretarial role, Ms. Helen Nowak who has been a great addition to our department but she leaves for Law school this fall. We have been fortunate to hire a new secretary, Mr. Alexander Nowak. There has been a learning curve for these new positions as well as an infusion of new ideas to make department life more effective and enjoyable.
- 3. ECP continued its high level of productivity with respect to publications and grant awards.
- 4. ECP underwent multiple reviews by professional organisations this year. These reviews are described below by program.

C) Objectives 2007-2008

- We will act on the recommendations from the APA, OPQ and CREPUQ reports to ensure that our programs remain vibrant, effective and tightly monitored. To remain vibrant we continue to seek approval for a new position in Counselling Psychology. The Counselling Psychology program had 2 retirees, Professor Frank Dumont and Ted Maroun in 2006, that have not been replaced. This program is accredited by the APA, CPA and most recently the OPQ. The OPQ only recommended a 2-year accreditation for this program. Part of their hesitancy in granting a longer accreditation was due to their belief that we needed more staff to serve the graduate student population.
- We will also seek approval for a position in the special populations of learners/inclusive education program to reach a critical teaching and research mass for this program.
- School Psychology will start the process of seeking accreditation from the Canadian Psychological Association.
- After much consultation a proposal for the Applied Developmental Program was considered and a decision to move forward with a new program titled "Human Development" will be proposed for academic approval in this upcoming year.

D) Program Updates

<u>Cognition and Instruction</u> program had a CREPUQ directed review of the Ph.D. programs majoring in Applied Cognitive Science and Instructional Psychology. This favourable review underscored the importance of merging the two streams of Applied Cognitive Science and Instructional Psychology into a common Learning Sciences Program. This process has commenced by unifying the two majors both at the Master's and PhD level and removing the minor requirement from the PhD programs majoring in Applied Cognitive Science and Instructional Psychology. Formal approval was received this year for a new MEd stream in Learning Sciences. We will seek approval for a name change for the PhD/MA program to Learning Sciences in the coming academic year.

<u>The School of Applied/Child Psychology</u> program was examined from a range of perspectives: at the international (American Psychological Association-APA) and provincial levels (Ordre des Psychologues du Québec –OPQ and by the Conférence des recteurs et des principaux des universités du Québec-CREPUQ). The APA renewed the accreditation of this program for another 5 years. The OPQ reviewed the program for the first time and noted its uniqueness in terms of incorporating a wide range of perspective and theories on child development, accessibility to a diversity of research methodologies and opportunities provided by the program's different research programs and labs, and its clinical program. OPQ also recommended a five-year accreditation period for the program. The CREPUQ external assessor was very positive as well.

<u>**Counselling Psychology**</u> was reviewed and accredited by the OPQ this year for a 2 year period. The most significant recommendation by OPQ for the Counselling psychology program was to increase the critical mass of core faculty and to achieve a common vision for the direction of the program. The APA/CPA and OPQ accreditation process was used for the CREPUQ review for the PhD and the CREPUQ reviews for the MA program were submitted for a Fall 2007 visit.

<u>Special Populations of Learners</u> program was successfully reviewed by CREPUQ this year for its PhD, MA and MEd offerings.

SECTION II: PAST YEAR HIGHLIGHTS AND ACTIVITIES

A) Faculty Members Awards and Recognition

- Professor **Robert Bracewell** is the Associate Dean, Research and Graduate Studies in the Faculty of Education. He is responsible for facilitating the ongoing development of successful research programs, as well as the coordination of graduate student life across the Faculty.
- Professor Jake Burack was a visiting scholar at the University of Cambridge.
- Professor **Glenn Cartwright** continues his role as Associate Dean of Continuing Education
- Professor **Kim Cornish** was promoted to Full Professor. She was also awarded a Canadian Research Chair Tier 1 in Developmental Neuroscience and Education and won the Senior Scientist Award from the Wellcome Trust in the UK. She continues to be an Honorary Professor in Psychology, College of Education, Zhejiang Normal University, Jinhua, Zhejiang, China.
- Professor **Jeffrey Derevensky**, Gold and Silver Medal Winner at the Horizon International Interactive Media Productions Awards. He was a Visiting Professor, at University of Auckland.
- Professor Martin Drapeau was elected to the Ordre des Psychologues du Québec Board of Directors and Executive Committee and President of the Continuing Education Committee of the OPQ. He also and Chaired the FQRSC grant committee 8A. He holds an FRSQ Chercheur Boursier and was nominated for the Carrie Derrick Award in Graduate Supervision and for the Principal's Award for Excellence in Teaching. Additionally he was awarded a CFI to renovate our current psychoeduational and counselling clinic into a state-of-the-art facility. He has worked non-stop this year with the Director of the current clinic, **Professor Jack DeStefano** to complete the new facilities.
- Professor **Carl Frederiksen** serves on an International Advisory Board on Collaborative Efforts of Research on Learning, Helsinki. He was also invited to speak at La Sorbonne, University of Paris.
- Professor **Nancy Heath** was a guest editor for 2 journals, Thalamus and Exceptionality Education Canada. She is a William Dawson scholar in resilience and at-risk youth, and a Fellow in the International Society for Learning Disabilities.
- Professor **Susanne Lajoie** is the Co-Chair of the International Intelligent Tutoring Systems Conference. She is a scientific advisor to the European Commission Network of Excellence (Kaleidoscope), James McGill Professor in computers as cognitive tools and a Fellow of the American Psychological Society.
- Professor Lynn McAlpine, won the Canadian Society for Studies in Higher Education Research Award. She also chaired the organizing committee for an International conference on Challenging Research Pedagogies held in the faculty. She is currently a visiting professor at Oxford.

- Professor **Jeeseon Park** was the Co-Chair for the International Mentoring and Orientation committee of the International section of Div. 17 Society for Counselling Psychology.
- Professor Alenoush Saroyan was an Adjudication panel member for SSHRC.
- Professor **Robert Savage** was promoted to Associate Professor. He won 2 awards with his co-authors for best paper in the Pediatrics and Child Health journal and the Canadian Journal of Speech Language Pathology and Audiology.
- Professor Victoria Talwar won the President's New Researcher award from the Canadian Psychological Association.
- Professor **Cynthia Weston** continues as Director of Teaching and Learning Services.

B) Teaching and Learning

The department teaching evaluations are consistently high with overall department average for the year being 4/5. Several faculty members were nominated by their graduate students for teaching and supervision awards this year: Professors Robert Bracewell for the David Thompson award, Nancy Heath and Martin Drapeau for the Carrie Derrick Award and Jeeseon Park and Martin Drapeau for the Principal's Prize for Excellence in Teaching. The department will continue to support their nominations in upcoming years. We have acted on the APA/OPQ recommendations by directing more funds toward the psychological test library so that a bottleneck in the reservation process does not hamper student training. We have also implemented a more systematic record keeping of tests signed in and out, more detailed information on the tests available, and most importantly, a new and improved test ordering and return service. We have also updated the website regarding undergraduate admission requirements so that prospective students know at the time of application what the admission requirements are in terms of number and type of undergraduate courses needed as pre-requisites. The provincial agencies have recommended that more of the clinical core program team, especially those that teach the clinical practicum, should be licensed as OPQ members so that they can better address the needs of the francophone population. Clinical faculty members are pursuing licensure.

i) Program Modifications

As mentioned in our highlights all of our programs have been reviewed extensively this year. Two of our PhD programs, counselling psychology and special populations of learners, adapted their comprehensive exams this year making the process and procedures more in line with the other ECP PhD programs. A new MEd in Learning Sciences was approved. Discussions have begun about the sustainability of the MEd in Family Life. The cognition and instruction program has dropped the minor requirement for the PhD.

ii) Student Highlights

Thirty-six of our graduate students received major external awards. These awards were from the following agencies: SSHRC (including the prestigious Canada Graduate Scholarship); FQRSC (Doctoral and Masters awards) and the faculty's first ever CIHR Doctoral award. This is a remarkable achievement by our students given the competitiveness of each award. In addition, 6 students received the Canadian Psychological Association Certificate of Academic Excellence. In total, our department had 3 post-doctoral fellows, and 129 students were funded either as research assistants, graduate assistants, teaching assistants or course lecturers.

C) Research

ECP productivity places us at the forefront of Canadian departments in the same discipline with regard to research. The number of published items by ECP professors (Table II) has been consistently high over the last five years. The 2006 calculation is based on 25 active tenure track faculty members and the average number of publications per person is 3.12, with and an additional 4.36 publications per person in press. See Appendix V for a detailed list of publications.

The research grant revenues for ECP are significant. Many of the grants are interuniversity, interdisciplinary and international. The granting agencies and foundations include: CIHR; Health Canada, NIH, Max Bell, FQRSC, FRSQ. SSHRC, CFI, Scotia Bank, MELS, CEFRIO and Wellcome Trust UK. Many of the researchers are working with international teams of researchers (see list of co-authors on publications to see international diversity – Appendix V, ix). Some of the collaborative projects that ECP faculty members are involved in within McGill are the McGill Centre for Research on Language, Mind and Brain (Carl Frederiksen, Janet Donin, Robert Savage), CIHR (Kim Cornish), Social Work, Psychiatry (Martin Drapeau) MNI, Psychology (Kim Cornish), and Centre for Medical Education (Susanne Lajoie, Cynthia Weston).

Collaborative projects outside of McGill are the Center for the Study of Learning and Performance (Mark Aulls, Lynn McAlpine, Cynthia Weston, Robert Savage, Bruce Shore), Ecole Eloignee en Reseau (MELS, CEFRIO) with Laval and Sherbrooke (Alain Breuleux); National Alliance for Autism Research, National Network for Aboriginal Mental Health Research (Jake Burack), Canadian Institutes of Health Research (Kim Cornish , Jake Burack), NIH (Kim Cornish, Carl Frederiksen), GRITI (Carl Frederiksen, Janet Donin, Susanne Lajoie), SSHRC INE (Susanne Lajoie), and MCRI (Nancy Heath).

Currently, ECP researchers have international collaborations with Australia, Belgium, Brazil, China, Germany, Greece, Israel, Indonesia, Japan, Mexico, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, South Africa, South Korea, Switzerland, the United Kingdom and the United States.

D) Involvement in the Community

Researchers in ECP are greatly involved in the community in both educational and clinical settings. Many of the ECP faculty have transferred their research discoveries about childhood disabilities to parents, teachers, and the community.

- Professor Cornish has Quebec's first Fragile-X syndrome research and resource center and provides a parent and teacher conferences and 'virtual' resource initiatives to help translate research discoveries to the practical domain. She and Professor Slee have established an inclusive education resource tool that will facilitate classroom learning for all students with developmental disabilities from kindergarten onwards.
- Professor Heath is part of an International alliance to reduce self-injury in youth and she has established a resource website for parents, teachers and youth that provides information and support.
- Professor Sladeczek has developed a parent support group initiative for parents of children with behaviour difficulties. Many individual faculty members work closely with the Community to help inform parents and teachers about risk factors, be they genetic or otherwise, preventing learning problems and identifying appropriate interventions for addiction problems as well as behavior/emotional problems.

For further information about the research in our Department see Burack, Cornish, Derevensky, Heath, Shaw, Sladeczek, Talwar. In typical populations, much of the community involvement entails literacy as well as educational innovations that are being researched in schools from elementary to higher education (see Aulls, Bracewell, Breuleux, Donin, Frederiksen, Hoover, Lajoie, McAlpine, Saroyan, Savage, Shore, Stringer, Weston).

ECP researchers have also transferred their research to government action. Professor Talwar gave a Parliamentary Brief that led to Bill C-2, a law that improved the competency procedures for permitting children to testify while adopting suggested procedures for enhancing the likelihood of promoting truthful testimony from young children. Professor Derevensky has provided testimony before multiple government parliamentary commissions to reduce the harms associated with adolescent addictive behaviors.
