All students moving from the MA to the PhD in Human Development must register for EDPE 683-001 - Human Development Seminar 3 - CRN: 8378

Students moving from the MA to the PhD in Human Development can take EDPH 689 in the Fall, Winter, or Summer of Year 1 or 2. New students should take this course during Year 2. This is a required course in the program.
