Tenure-track Position in Physical and Health Education Pedagogy

The Department of Kinesiology and Physical Education, one of the three academic units of the Faculty of Education at McGill University, invites applications for a **tenure-stream appointment** at the rank of Assistant Professor, effective August 1, 2015. To qualify, a candidate must hold a doctoral degree in physical and health education pedagogy or a related discipline and should have a strong track record of research publications and some University teaching experience.

McGill University is a world-renowned English-language institution located in the heart of cosmopolitan Montreal and is ranked among the world's top universities. The Department of Kinesiology and Physical Education enjoys the privilege of being amongst the first in Canada to offer a physical education teacher education program as early as 1912 and continues to foster an active and distinguished program in Physical and Health Education.

The department is seeking an individual with demonstrated expertise in the area of physical and health education pedagogy, an emerging and/or outstanding research profile demonstrated by excellent publications and national or international conference presentations, an ability to attract external funding, and evidence of strong university teaching skills and experience. The individual's research and teaching responsibilities are expected to contribute to health promotion and physical activity engagement in healthy populations or populations with chronic disorders or disabilities across the lifespan. The successful candidate will be expected to contribute to the academic and research activities of the department's Research Center for Physical Activity and Health. Duties will also include the supervision of graduate students, teaching of undergraduate and graduate courses in physical and health education pedagogy and participation in service to our department, profession, and local community. Some successful K-12 physical and health education teaching experience as well as strong interpersonal, social, and communicative skills would be considered important assets.

Salary will be commensurated with qualifications and experience. All qualified applicants are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority. McGill University is committed to equity in employment and diversity. It welcomes applications from indigenous peoples, visible minorities, ethnic minorities, persons with disabilities, women, persons of minority sexual orientations and gender identities, and others who may contribute to further diversification. English is the language of instruction at McGill, but knowledge of French is an asset.
