PROGRAM AND RESEARCH AREAS

The School offers a Master of Urban Planning (M.U.P.) degree that is accredited by the Ordre des urbanistes du Québec and the Canadian Institute of Planners, as well as an ad hoc Ph.D. in Urban Planning, Policy and Design. In addition, a formal specialization in urban design is offered within the M.U.P. program, and all students may elect to complete a semester in Barbados as part of the Barbados Field Study program.

Research interests within the School include: planning history and theory, metropolitan development and governance, urban design, landscape planning and ecology, housing and urban form, environmental policy and planning, sustainable community development, university-community partnerships, planning in developing countries, land use and transportation planning. The School is a founding member of Villes et développement, a Montreal-based interuniversity group that facilitates research and teaching in developing countries.
