



Internship Opportunity with Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute (STRI) Summer 2011

POSITION TITLE: Environmental Education Assistant LOCATION: Colon, Panama

DESCRIPTION OF HOST ORGANIZATION:

The internship will take place at the Punta Galeta marine laboratory of STRI, located on the Caribbean coast of Panama in the Province of Colon. It was established in 1964. The main priority is research, but we also value communicating the results of this research to non-scientific audiences in order to increase awareness and understanding of the natural world. The station is a place where individuals can increase their awareness and appreciation of coastal and marine environments in Panama and nearby regions of South and Central America. Its goal is to increase public understanding of Panama's past and present coastal environments and promote their conservation. It is also meant to demonstrate how scientific discoveries both improve our understanding and deepen our appreciation of the natural world.

INTERN'S DUTIES/JOB DESCRIPTION:

The intern's mandate will be to assist the staff in the development and functioning of the educational program of the research center. Selected interns are expected to lead tours of the station with local and international visitors and develop environmental education tools adapted to the general public on the environmental issues of interest to the exhibit center. Interns may also have the opportunity to participate in ongoing research projects at the station.

Interns' duties and projects may not be as listed. These will depend on the needs of the host organization.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Students with a background in Environmental Sciences, Geography, IDS, Education
- Experience and/or a strong interest in conservation and environmental issues.
- Fluent Spanish
- Strong interpersonal skills
- McGill U2 or U3 Arts student specializing in Political Science, Economics, International Development Studies, International Relations, or other relevant fields;
- The intern must bring her or his own laptop.
- Minimum GPA of 3.0
- Returning to McGill full-time in the fall
- Students must fulfill Faculty of Arts requirements as outlined in the Handbook for Interns at <u>www.mcgill.ca/arts-internships/forms</u>

HOURS: The intern can expect to work full time from May 16th to August 6th, 2011.

REMUNERATION: Unpaid internship

COSTS: The intern is responsible for all costs associated with the internship including transportation, accommodations, visas, medical costs, etc.

Interns will pay \$13/day USD for accommodations at the Institute and will have access to markets to purchase food and kitchenettes to prepare meals. Students should budget approximately \$650/month USD to cover accommodations and meals.

Travel arrangements: Preparing travel arrangements to and from your internship host community is the responsibility of the intern.

HOW TO APPLY: Students must submit both electronic applications by e-mail <u>and</u> hard copies in person. In person, to Leacock room 307:

Important Information – please read prior to applying for this internship:

Applicants must ensure that they are physically and mentally capable of successfully completing an internship in the internship host country. The Arts Internship Office may request a doctor's attestation that an applicant is sufficiently healthy to complete an internship.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

Interns are responsible for informing themselves of what entry requirements are required to visit and work as an intern in the internship host country. These may include a visa, work permit, passport valid for at least 6 months after entry, and proof of certain vaccinations.

The intern is responsible for acquiring all necessary documents in time for the beginning of their internship.
