# Camper's Guide



## Drop-off (7:30 to 9 a.m. / free from 8:30 - 9 a.m.)

Every day, rain or shine, arrivals and departures are at the main entrance of:

### Schulich School of Music of McGill University

555 Sherbrooke Street W. at the corner of Union Street (one block east of University Street), McGill metro (See map)

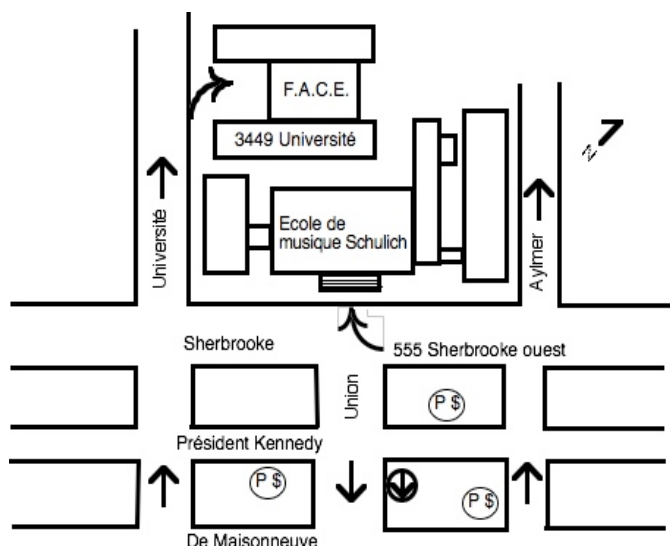
**The first morning:** Tell your parents to park their car on the street or in a parking lot before they bring you inside the building (see map). If your parents have 150,000 questions (!) to ask your camp counsellor, tell them to plan a 15- to 30-minute period for this first meeting. Otherwise, your parents can expect it to take around 15 minutes to come in the building, wait a little bit before we tell you where your group is, say hi to your camp counsellor, take your 2 snacks out of your lunch box and put them into the snack bin of your group (see Food), give you a hug and a big kiss, wish you a great day and leave the building!

**Following mornings:** For security reasons, tell your parents they need to accompany you into the building. To do so, they will have to park their car on the street or in a parking lot (see map). Since your parents will no longer have (hopefully) 150,000 questions to ask your camp counsellor (!), it should take no more than 5 minutes!

## Pick-up (4 to 6 p.m. / free from 4 - 4:30 p.m.)

**For all departures:** Unless your parents have warned us in writing that you will be leaving on your own, your parents will have to come pick you up in the pre- and after-camp room (this is the same place they left you in the morning). Tell them that an I.D. card will be required, and they will have to sign you out. Since every parent will have to sign their child out, suggest that they wear a big smile (even if this procedure takes a while). We understand that they've had a long day at work and are anxious to get home for supper, and we will make the process as quick and painless as possible :) table.

## Pre- and after-camp supervision

**Arrivals: 7:30 to 9 AM**

**(FREE from 8:30 to 9:00 AM)**

**Departures: 4 to 6 PM**

**(FREE from 4:00 to 4:30 PM)**

When you registered, you had the choice between:

- 1- Taking the supervision package (which will cost your folks \$22.50 per week)
- 2- Paying "à la carte." If you arrive before 8:30 am or leave after 4:30 pm, it will cost you \$1.50 for each half-hour you stay (payable at the moment you arrive or leave).

Please note that parents who exceed the 6 p.m. after-camp supervision closing time will be asked to pay a two-dollar (\$2) per child late fee for every extra five-minute period. The total amount of the late fee will be paid in cash directly to the supervising counsellor, immediately when you pick up your child.

Please also note that on the last Friday of each two-week session, there is no After-Camp supervision due to of the End-of-Camp Show.

## Absences

If you foresee being absent from camp, please notify us in advance by email.

In order to avoid disrupting ongoing projects, campers who are absent for more than 2 consecutive days without prior arrangements with the coordinator will not be allowed to return to the camp

## Food

Since your daily schedule is packed with activities, we recommend that you:

- Have a good breakfast before coming to camp;
- Bring your lunch, ideally in a lunch box containing an "ice pack." Please note that we have NEITHER refrigerators NOR microwave ovens;
- Bring two healthy snacks that can be kept at room temperature, each labelled with your name.
- Bring a bottle of water: Again, don't forget to write your name on it!!!

For the sake of good nutrition, safety and time constraints, vending machines are off-limits during Camp hours. There is no need to bring cash to camp.

## Green Lunches

As you've probably heard, our planet needs some taking care of, so we asked ourselves how we could help out!

Here's how ;

- By bringing your lunch in a lunch box rather than in a plastic bag;
- By putting your food and your juice in reusable containers rather than in plastic bags and disposable juice boxes;
- By recycling and composting every lunch at camp!
- **AND by helping mom and dad with the dishes when you get home :)**

## Clothing

Make sure to bring:

- sun-glasses & sun-screen;
- a hat or cap;
- comfortable active-wear;
- good sneakers, **no sandals!!**
- You do not need to bring a smock! There are so many shirts or smocks for Arts and Crafts that were lost and "not" found at Camp in the past that you we have plenty to go around!

To avoid losing anything, **make sure to put name-tags** on all items you bring to Camp: clothes, raincoats and boots, umbrellas, lunch boxes, costumes, accessories, etc.
