

Why McGill?

McGILL IS UNIQUE. The university combines an international reputation for overall excellence with particularly notable programs – including dentistry – that routinely attract students from around the world. In the eight years Gallup has posed the question, McGill has also ranked tops with Canadians in a nation-wide poll.

McGill offers students unbeatable extras to their top-notch education: a rich cultural diversity and high standard of living in a vibrant, cosmopolitan city. Half the student body has a mother tongue other than English or French. Strongly qualified students meet their academic peers: McGill students routinely scoop up national awards. Its graduates attain prominence: 115 students are Rhodes scholars, the most of any university in Canada.

As befits an illustrious program that dates from the 1920s, dentistry at McGill does not rest on its laurels. The curriculum was recently improved by reducing class size, emphasizing general health care, and



incorporating the latest developments in dental education.

The university's quality programs result in degrees that are recognized the world over.

Graduates are accepted to top graduate schools and begin strong careers from their McGill base. Invaluable aid is provided by faculty who do pioneering work, produce illustrious research papers, and garner more research dollars per capita than any other Canadian university. Students benefit from connections provided by faculty linked to 73 international research centres, as well as Canada's research centres of excellence.

It's no surprise that nearly one-sixth of the 166,000 McGill alumni live and work in 155 countries outside North America, or that applications from international students number about 4,500 each year. International students make up close to 20 percent of this past year's incoming class, and represent nearly one-quarter of graduate students.

The only surprise is often for students in their first year, when successful applicants realize just how lucky they are to have been accepted.

It's Not a Secret Formula

Grads prevail anywhere thanks to rigorous grounding in the basics

Every dentistry graduate emphasizes a different aspect of how his or her McGill education led to success.

Though he earned his diploma 25 years ago, Dr. David Lipnowski says "though nothing is the same because of a gradual change in materials, equipment and instruments, everything I do is based on what I learned at McGill. I never said, 'I don't like this method.'"

McGill methods are justified at every step by solid research and reasoning, adds the Ottawa dentist, and the one way students are taught to perform each operation ensures a good result for patients in the chair.

"They teach quality over quantity," says Lipnowski. "You learn to do your first procedure really well, spending a disproportionate amount of time doing it, with the philosophy that the second time, it will go faster."

Dr. Peter Coakley of Massachusetts praises the communication skills that allowed him to present treatments clearly to patients. "My practice was very successful right away," says the 1973 graduate. "No one knows anything when you start, not even how to hold an instrument. A lot of my success had to do with McGill. When I graduated I could do good dentistry."

When growing up in Lunenburg, Massachusetts, Dr. Michael Cronin's father – a McGill grad himself – told his son in no uncertain terms that he would also be studying there.

"He knew that, compared to other schools, including Tufts and Georgetown, my education would be superior. And he was right. The school expects more." Dr. Cronin credits the diagnostic ability he learned at McGill. "We were taught to look at the big picture. The first time you see the patient, you work out in your mind logically what needs to be done. We were very well prepared."

"McGill guys stand out when they come in contact with graduates from other universities," proclaims Dr. Robin Jackson, a native Montrealer who established himself as the first orthodontist in the now-thriving Vancouver suburb of Richmond in 1970.

"I was impressed by the closeness of the people at the school, including faculty and support staff. I viewed it as a family, almost."

When Duncan Moran returned to Bermuda with his McGill degree in dentistry 28 years ago, he felt ready for just about anything.

"When I started, in comparison to others, it was like I'd had five years in practice," he says. "There was no problem dealing with day-to-day procedures. Anything a patient could throw at me, I could do something about. We were also well trained to keep on learning."

"I'm just glad I didn't go anywhere else. I got a damn good education."

and will be one of the first recipients of a Canada Research Chair funded by the Federal budget.

"It's a fairly new field," says Dr. Bennett of pain research, especially chronic pain. "The drugs we use to treat acute moderate to severe pain are extraordinarily effective, but difficult to use over long periods of time because they are opiates."

"For the first time, these past six or seven years, many new drugs have been

International Stature, International Students

Broad cultural mix and small class size enhance McGill's sterling

When Jennifer Charbonneau walks into class, it's like stepping into the 1950s. Fellow dentistry students hail from the Middle East, Asia, Europe and the Caribbean, as well as from across Canada and the United States.

"Coming from Newmarket, Ontario, I'd never been exposed to this before," said the second-year student. "It's really nice."

Encouraging applications from elsewhere makes sense on many levels to Faculty of Dentistry Dean James Lund. "We want to make sure we have the best qualified students possible," he says. The result is a cultural mix unrivalled by any other school in Canada. Lund adds, and a widespread group of graduates "whose McGill training helps their own communities, and who act as ambassadors for the university."

This year, more than half the students accepted by the faculty live outside Quebec.

Students are attracted not only by McGill's longstanding reputation as one of the world's best dental schools. They are drawn by low tuition and a revamped curriculum that features a strong integration with general health care, the latest trends in dentistry, and classes of no more than 30 students.

"All the professors know you and know what kind of work you do – it's a warm feeling," says Demetrios Petropoulos, who applied to McGill because he says the teaching, facilities and reputation are better than dental schools in his native Greece. "You have just one demonstrator for every four of five students, and that's just not possible where I come from."

"I enjoyed the people, they were very friendly," says Dr. Newton Gordon, who came from Jamaica to study in the 1970s and is now professor of oral and maxillofacial surgery at the University of California, San Francisco. "Staff support you all the way through your education. You don't get lost as you would in large institutions in the United States."

Many become so enamoured of the city itself that they continue to return, years later, to enjoy Montreal's bilingual nature and cosmopolitan attractions.

"I didn't even apply to Harvard," says Dr. Peter Coakley, a Boston-area student who graduated 25 years ago. "I wanted a different experience." He was not disappointed. "The city is so beautiful. I go back every year because I'm in love with it."

Having free street entertainment, like the popular Jazz Festival, a short stroll from campus is a bonus for Mark Martin, who interrupted his plastic surgery medical residency at McGill to earn a dentistry doctorate. It is McGill's well-developed dental cleft palate program, however, that drew him.

"Taking dentistry here will improve my understanding of orthodontic medicine," says the Winnipeg-born student, "and patients will get better treatment because of that. It will improve cooperation within the team of specialists that treat cleft palate patients."

"Applicants are often second generation" says Vancouver resident Michelle Lee. "It's a family tradition. My father (Kenneth K.S. Lee, DSc'66) came to McGill from Indonesia – he didn't speak English or French and he struggled quite a bit. But he thought it was a good school and he had a really good time."

Students appreciate Montreal's low cost of living. "It's way cheaper to study here than in Ontario," says Charbonneau, who cited low fees as her primary reason for choosing McGill. Now class president, she is equally impressed with the quality of fellow classmates. Dr. Gordon is trying to convince his sons to attend McGill partly

"because it would cost less than California." Dr. David Lipnowski, a Montrealer now practicing in Ottawa, explains his choice of university this way: "When you grow up in Vancouver, you ski Whistler. When you grow up in McGill's backyard, if you can get in, you've got to go."

"I didn't shop for schools," says Dr. Robin Jackson, another ex-Montrealer now living in Vancouver. "It was home, it was close, and that's where I went. I lucked out."

Research Knows No Boundaries

U.S. pain expert appointed research chair

Montreal has a deserved reputation as having the world's greatest concentration of talented clinicians and scientists examining pain. That reputation has enticed Dr. Gary Bennett from MCP Hahnemann University to become Director of Clinical Research at McGill's Pain Clinic.

As of April 1, Bennett will be installed as Associate Professor, a joint appointment shared between Dentistry and Anaesthesia,

found that are effective in treating some chronic pain. Scientific research into pain is one of the busiest and most productive areas of neurological research right now."

Dr. Bennett, whose own research has been evenly divided between animals and people, is looking forward to "taking my research from the bench to the bedside." The McGill University Pain Clinic, which relies mainly on a dozen part-time staff and a half-dozen consulting specialists, is

anticipating Dr. Bennett's leadership in extending its work and expanding its staff. Last year, the clinic had 1,690 patient visits; this year's budget is nearly \$290,000.

Dr. Bennett is currently Director of Pain Research and Quantitative Sensory Testing and Autonomic Nervous Testing Laboratories in Philadelphia, and has been Chief of the Neuropathic Pain and Pain Measurement Section of the National Institutes of Health in Maryland.



Message from the Dean

Since the last newsletter was published, there have been several important developments at the Faculty. Dr. Marie Dagenais took over as Associate Dean (Academic) from the late beloved Dr. Howard Katz, and has done her very best to manage the development of the curriculum. Dr. Tim Head took over as Director of the Division of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery from Dr. Ken Bentley, who has retired, and several new faculty members have been appointed to strengthen both teaching and research. I am particularly proud of the fact that the Faculty, in collaboration with the Department of Anaesthesia, has been able to attract Dr. Gary Bennett to McGill. Dr. Bennett is one of the world's best scientists working on pain, and just before Christmas, we found out

that he had been awarded one of the first of the new Canada Research Chairs, which will bring about \$2 million to the Faculty over ten years. McGill also honoured Dr. Marc McKee, our Associate Dean (Research and Graduate Studies) by naming him a Dawson Scholar.

As many of you know, I am not a graduate of McGill, and I did not teach here before I became Dean five and a half years ago. Looking in from the outside, I had always had the impression that McGill grads were more successful than the average, and that a very large percentage of each graduating class went on to specialty training. However, once I began at McGill, I realised that my impressions were based on the local scene; I knew almost nothing about the situation outside Montreal.


Therefore, I decided to meet as many of the McGill graduates as I could by travelling to dental meetings, across Canada, and in the USA. As you know, Debbie Larocque and

Dr. Norman Miller have also been attending meetings, and organising receptions in order to meet as many of you as possible. However, we never really knew just where all our graduates were; we knew that there was a lot in Ottawa, Toronto and Vancouver, but that was all. So for this issue, we decided to produce the McGill Dentistry Mappa Mundi, which you saw on the first page. It is as accurate as we can make it, although I have heard a rumour that the accuracy of our count in Florida (19) is being contested.

You will see that there are dentists in every Province and Territory of Canada except the Yukon, who trained at McGill. We also have grads in 29 of the states of the USA, and in 15 other countries. I know that many dentists who practice in Ontario and the West are part of the Anglo Diaspora that left Quebec in the last 30 years, but many others came to McGill for training and then returned home. This tradition continues, and between 30% and 50% of the students in each of the four years of the Dentistry

program come from outside Quebec.

Nowadays, many professional schools in Canada and the USA take few students from outside their Province or State, and even at McGill, government restrictions mean that very few out-of-province students can get into Medicine. As I travelled around, I met many alumni who assumed that the same policy applied to Dentistry, and they were surprised when I told them that this was not the case. So, if any of you have children or grandchildren who would like to become dentists, or if you know other worthy candidates, please encourage them to apply to McGill, if they have the necessary qualifications. We are very proud of McGill's record of training for the international marketplace, and are making a strong effort to attract the best applicants from home and abroad.

Faculty Highlights



Research Matters by Marc D. McKee, Associate Dean (Research and Graduate Studies)


By all measures, it has been an amazing year for research. Whereas nationwide expenditures for research and development have been dismally low the past 10 years, recently a huge increase in research program funding has occurred both provincially and federally. While critics would say old levels of funding are simply being reestablished, the increases are clearly moving at a pace whose momentum bodes well for the future of scientific research in Canada – especially in biomedical and health-related fields. The overall objective of the *Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR)*, previously known as the Medical Research Council (MRC) of Canada, is to reach a level of funding for research in the next few years that represents 1% of the total health care budget. This means a target of one billion dollars annually for health-related research. In addition to substantial increases in the base budgets of major granting councils this year and last, a number of important new initiatives have been implemented in the year 2000.

Firstly, the new CIHR has acquired a broader mandate to cover many health-related issues not previously funded by its predecessor. There is also a new president,

Dr. Alan Bernstein. Some old programs have been abandoned, while other more interdisciplinary and expanded programs have been created. CIHR's mission will be centered around 13 new Institutes broadly covering most fields of biomedical and health-related research. While many of us in the oral health field lobbied intensely to have our own institute dedicated solely to supporting our somewhat unique research interests, this did not occur. The massive restructuring resulted in a limited number of Institutes. Oral health researchers will now find that the mandate of the *Institute of Musculoskeletal Health and Arthritis* perhaps best fits their research programs, as oral health care and dentistry are specifically mentioned in the preamble describing the mission of this institute.

["The CIHR Institute of Musculoskeletal Health and Arthritis will support research to enhance active living, mobility and movement, and dental health; and to address causes, prevention, screening, diagnosis, treatment, support systems, and palliation for a wide range of conditions related to bones, joints, muscles, connective tissue, skin and teeth."]

Institute directors and advisory board members are expected to be announced in January of 2001, and it is anticipated that



Dentistry will be represented by one or more members on the advisory board.

Secondly, in recognition of the steady deterioration of research infrastructure within the Canadian university system, a federal initiative entitled the *Canada Foundation for Innovation (CFI)* has injected approximately \$800 million (with matching funds from provincial, corporate and private sources) into upgrading university equipment and research facilities. McGill University as a whole was highly successful in the last CFI competition, and Faculty of Dentistry researchers were prominent in securing almost \$4 million for a new *Montreal Centre for Advanced Bone and Periodontal Research*. This research facility will be equipped with state-of-the-art biomedical equipment and laboratories to study afflictions such as osteoporosis and

periodontal disease. Other Dentistry researchers participated in the CFI-funded *Multicentre Pain Research Initiative* that received almost \$5 million to establish a "unique network of core facilities for the integrated study of pain in its multiple dimensions."

At the provincial level, the *Fonds de la Recherche en santé du Québec (FRSQ)* is operating with an increased budget of \$65 million, up from \$45 million, and the *Réseau de recherche en santé bucco-dentaire*, linking Québec's oral health investigators in a research network, is a major beneficiary of this funding agency. A second major funding organization, *Valorisation-Recherche Québec*, has been established in the province to fund innovative projects that benefit Québec society, and some of this money is also available for support staff salaries to operate the equipment and facilities funded by CFI.

Within the Faculty, there is an upbeat feeling arising from these increased funding levels and from recent successes by faculty investigators in national and provincial competitions. Faculty of Dentistry researchers remain prominent on the international scene, and are publishing in the top-ranked journals worldwide. Expect to hear more on these accomplishments in the future, as the improved research area in Québec and Canada will allow for even better experimental plans utilizing novel technologies and newly acquired, world-class instrumentation. 

New Curriculum makes the Grade

Dr. Marie Dagenais and Dr. Jeffrey Myers presented a poster entitled "Integrating with Medicine: the McGill Experience" at the April 2000 meeting of the American Association of Dental Schools in Washington D.C. The poster summarized an educational project carried out by Dr. Marie Dagenais, the late Dr. Howard Katz, Dr. Jeffrey Myers, Dr. Dana Hawley, Dr. Jocelyne Feine and Dr. James P. Lund. The authors compared the performance of the last class using the old curriculum (Class of 1999) with that of the first class using the new curriculum (Class of 2000).

They used several measures of competence to compare the two classes, including the evaluation of 48 specific clinical competencies by the clinic instructors, the students' evaluation of their own level of preparedness, patients' evaluations of their satisfaction, clinical productivity, and results on the American Board examinations.

The results of this project suggest an increase in clinical productivity in the Class of 2000. The instructors rated both

classes as being equally prepared in 42 categories, but the Class of 2000 was rated significantly higher than the Class of 1999 in six categories. This difference was also reflected in the students' reports: the Class of 2000 felt more prepared than the Class of 1999 in seven categories. The patients rated the two classes equally on questions related to communication or competence but the Class of 2000 was rated higher in empathy. Both classes performed equally well on the American Board examination, except for the section Anatomical Sciences where the Class of 1999 out-performed the Class of 2000.

In the new curriculum, traditional basic sciences courses have been eliminated. Basic, applied and clinical science are taught in an integrated way, and much of the teaching is based on clinical situations. The clinic is run as a general practice, and patients are treated as people, not as a collection of clinical requirements. The presentation was very well received and stimulated a lot of interest in the dental education community.

Outreach Program

Canadian Dental Association Honours Outreach Program:

The Faculty of Dentistry Outreach Program was named one of two recipients of the Oral Health Promotion Award, presented for the first time this year. The ceremony honoring the recipients was held on September 16, 2000 at the Westin Hotel in Ottawa. Program Director Michael Wiseman, DDS'85, accepted the award. The Oral Health Promotion Award recognizes initiatives that accomplish one or more of the following: meet the oral health needs of a growing number of older Canadians; advance prevention in special populations and high-risk groups; reduce inequalities by improving the oral health status of disadvantaged groups and communities.

Outreach Program Update

The clinic has welcomed close to 1,000 patients since the start of the program in April of 1998, with treatments varying from oral diagnosis, periodontal treatment, preventive services, restorative dentistry, to oral surgery. The clinics have been enthusiastically attended by our volunteer students, auxiliaries and dentists. We must acknowledge the aid of Skulnick Transport, which provides free transportation of our equipment; Cote St. Luc Emergency Medical Service, which helps provide evaluation of all vital systems prior to treatment. Ms. Linda Thoms and her students from Western Laval High School, who aid in equipment setup and administrative duties; and Dentsply Canada, which provides free restorative supplies. We have also expanded the administration of the program to include Judiann Stern, who will work as Coordinator of the program, on a part-time basis.

Evening clinics have been provided to the following social agencies: Sun Youth, Teen Haven, Dans La Rue, and Jewish Family Services. A daytime sealant program has been established with the cooperation of CLSC Pointe St. Charles and the DSC Montreal to provide free sealants and fluoride treatments to children in the area who, due to financial difficulties, would not normally receive these non-RAMQ insurable services.

The Outreach Program is in need of support from dentists in the community. Evening clinics are both socially and emotionally rewarding.

If, due to other commitments, volunteering for this program is not an option for you, then please consider assisting the program by donating funds directly to the McGill Outreach Program, or by donating such items as handpieces and hand instruments.



The Outreach Program will soon obtain a dental van. This state-of-the-art van will be equipped with two complete dental operatories. It will be used for home visits to palliative care patients and geriatric shut-ins, and will promote a more formal comprehensive dental care in the community.







As a busy young dentist building his practice and teaching at McGill, Dr. Robert Faith was impressed by those who both worked and volunteered. But he did not consider doing the same. "I used to think, 'I could never do that,'" said Dr. Faith. "Then, one day, I was having lunch with the chairman of the Board of Governors – the president of

Marconi – and he said, 'You know, when people ask me to do something, it's usually fun. I've regretted it very, very seldom.' I thought about that."

The next time he was approached, Dr. Faith broke tradition and said "Yes." Now retired, he looks back on a decades-long volunteering career that includes being in charge of fundraising at Montreal Association for the Blind, serving as Chair of the Board at The Study private

school for girls, and serving as a member of the board of Bathaw Youth and Family Centres. Dentistry at McGill, however, remains his first allegiance. Dr. Faith is on the Board of Governors, is chair of the Faculty Advisory Board, and has been President of the Alumni Association. The list could go on and on.

Just as his mentor promised, Dr. Faith has seldom regretted a consistent volunteering regimen that he estimates has long

accounted for one-fifth of his working time.

"I enjoyed getting out of the office, meeting interesting people, and learning a whole lot," he said. "It's very broadening – and a great way to improve yourself. People who say 'No' all the time miss a lot."

Dr. Faith also sees it as payback for opportunity. "If not for the education I had at McGill, I would not be as successful as I've been. Society subsidizes schooling, and we have a certain duty to society."

Surrounded by worthy causes, many donors restrict themselves to one or two. Not so Arthur Lau, a architect who has helped eight faculties at

McGill alone – not to mention many organizations outside the university.

When asked why he supports the Faculty of Dentistry, despite having no direct connection, Lau says, "Health is important to everyone. Some people can't afford their time, others don't have the interest. But, in the end, everyone is counting on

health care.

"I've been working for education and health care all my life."

Lau assisted in attracting donations to dentistry at a crucial moment, when the program was in danger of shutting down in 1994.

"He played a large part in keeping the faculty open," said Dean James Lund. "He felt it was a very bad decision to close it down. Once that was accomplished, he felt he should stay on to help it to remain healthy and to grow."

"He has a total commitment to the university," says Vice-Principal, Development and Alumni Relations Derek Drummond, "and is able to transmit his enthusiasm to others – even to people as far away as Hong Kong."

Lau, an extremely active member

of the Board of Governors, has attracted several major donations and has personally contributed funding for the Wong Building, various chairs and scholarships. In dentistry he endowed an Entrance Scholarship in memory of his father Ping Kwan Lau, assisted in acquiring major

support to establish the Dr. Wah Leung Fellowship and just recently established the Dr. Soo Kim Lan Prize for a graduate student.

Not surprisingly, Lau was recently appointed to the Order of Canada for his extensive philanthropy.

Last year, Dr. Earl Lerner broke new ground when he decided to take McGill up on its offer to directly fund a scholarship for undergraduate students. He was the first student to commit \$2,000 each year over four years.

"I've been donating to my alma mater for years," he said. "I feel a great indebtedness to McGill and I have a great affinity for it." Lerner is enthusiastic about the more personal touch the scholarship allows. "I can meet the student – it's more responsibility."

Dr. Lerner, who has practiced

in Pointe Claire since completing post-graduate orthodontics at Columbia University in 1966, even offered to mentor last year's winning student – Brigitte Bigras – when he met her last fall.

"I don't come from a family of dentists and I had no mentor, no one to turn to when I was a student," he said. "Students are under a lot of stress, a lot of turmoil, and they may need to talk to someone when they have difficulty studying, or are a little discouraged."

Lerner has been an unwitting mentor in the past. He recently

met a former patient now in her fourth year of dentistry. He was flabbergasted when she told him, "You were instrumental in getting me interested in dentistry. I never forget the personal touch you had – asking me about how my hockey was going, or my cross-country skiing."

"I was a role model, and I didn't even know it!" said Lerner. Though it is just the first year of his commitment, Lerner already anticipates signing up again in 2003.

Mr. Paul Marchand, BCU'66, LLM'85

"The faculty was a huge part of

his life," says his son and McGill-trained lawyer, Paul R. Marchand. "College was a very big deal and meant an awful lot to him. He made lifelong friends here. He was a teacher, and the dentists he came to know from McGill remained very, very close."

"When we started the fund, I went up and saw the dean with my father. I wanted to get the fund started when he was alive and knew about it. He was not a well-to-do man, and was glad I was

doing something to support McGill dentistry."

While nurturing the endowment fund is a long-term endeavour for Marchand and the fund has not yet built sufficient capital to fund a scholarship or bursary, interest now generates an annual prize for a deserving fourth-year student.

Marchand Sr. was an unfatiguing McGill supporter. "He felt it was the model for others to follow," says his son. Marchand

entered the profession in the 1930s, at a time when Quebec dentists opted to pull rather than save teeth. He was horrified by the practice.

High-speed drills were unknown and anesthetics unsophisticated for much of his career, but Marchand's

patients make a point of telling his son, "You know, your father never hurt me."

Though a supporter of his own Faculty of Law, Marchand is proud and pleased to help Dentistry on his father's behalf – and to personally hand the Dr. Paul R. Marchand and Maurine McNeil Marchand Prize to a student during convocation.

Mrs. Pierrette Wong



Pierrette Wong recalls with painful precision the kind of dentistry she received as a child growing up on the island of Mauritius.

"We had mobile dental care that went from school to school, and you were lucky if you saw a dentist once a year. Very likely, by the time the dentist came, most children had a lot of pulling to be done," she said. "My tooth was pulled without anesthetic. I still remember I screamed so loud that the whole village could hear me."

So when Mrs. Wong heard from a friend about the Faculty of Dentistry's Outreach Clinic, where dental care is provided to anyone in need, the cause spoke directly to her heart.

Despite being busy with volunteering work and numerous fundraising efforts in the Chinese community, she soon agreed to co-chair the clinic's 1999 fundraising dinner.

"When you become aware of a program and you feel it's something you believe in and you can do something about, it's important to act," said Mrs. Wong. "For someone

asks me for help, I say, 'What is it for?' If there's a real need, I do it."

Mrs. Wong has looked for a way to honour her husband Janson ever since he died four years ago. She found the perfect way through the dental research component of the new Genome & Proteomics Centre to be located at McGill (this new building will be built on the current site of the Donner Building). It will be called The J.T.N. Wong Montreal Unit for Bone and Periodontal Research, thanks to her generosity.

Still, Mrs. Wong doubts her role. "Individually, you cannot do

much. Collectively, we can do quite a bit. We can make a difference."

"Nowadays, there are cuts everywhere, and not everyone can afford to go to the dentist. The Outreach Program is a very important addition to services provided by organizations like Sun Youth and Dans la Rue.

On volunteering generally, Wong says, "people look at me and think I have nothing better to do; people who know me know that I have to do it."

VOLUNTEER PHONATHONS THEY CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Each year in March and April, McGill University's Development office coordinates a major fundraising initiative in Montreal, Toronto and Vancouver. In each city, a group of volunteers works all evening, calling graduates and friends to solicit support for University priorities and thanking them for past support. These volunteers are graduates and students representing their respective faculties or departments, and the personal contact during a call is an excellent opportunity for discussion on recent developments in their areas. The Faculty of Dentistry has consistently been well represented in Montreal, particularly by its student body (recent phonathons have recruited anywhere from 15 to 20 students each year).

And sometimes I knew their fathers, having been to school with them, so we'd talk about that. Very little was mentioned about fundraising.

Existing programs at Sun Youth and Jewish Family Services are still in operation, and our mobile facilities now also offer dental services to homeless teenagers (Le bon Dieu dans la rue) and children of low-income families (at St. Gabriel School in Point St. Charles).
- Operations of our Student Dental Clinic, situated in McGill's new William and Mary Brown Student Services Building, started up successfully in April. One clinical unit is currently in place treating a large number of foreign and out-of-province students. We hope to install a second unit shortly.
- We created a new graduate fellowship (Dr. Yu-Ming Lam Fellowship) and two scholarships (the Dr. Yu-Ming Lam Entrance Scholarship and the Dr. Earl Lerner Faculty Scholarship). As soon as full funding is acquired, we hope to create the Dr. Howard S. Katz Scholarship in honor of our former Associate Dean of Academic Affairs who passed away in December 1999.

- We continued to upgrade clinical facilities, incorporating audiovisual and computer equipment, computerized patient registration and treatment planning programs, and patient information literature and videos.

We could not have achieved any of this without the flexibility made possible by the gifts of graduates and friends.

In this context, gifts received in this fund year (ending May 31, 2001) will confirm the direction we are taking. We hope to continue in our efforts to promote quality education and community service:

- We will create more undergraduate scholarships and graduate fellowships to attract the best students possible.
- We will continue to build our curriculum and expand pre-clinical and clinical teaching facilities.
- In addition, with your help, we will create new computer facilities at both the Strathcona and Montreal General Hospital Clinic, and continue computerizing teaching materials through the use of Web and CD-Rom technology.
- Another priority is to expand the Outreach Program to other organizations, and to finish financing a van that will serve as a truly mobile dental clinic. It will bring free dental care to those unable to visit the outreach clinics.


