**Professional Associate – Interprofessional Practice Project**

Applications are invited for the position of **Professional Associate for a community based interprofessional practice project**. Minimum requirements include (1) professional credentials and eligibility to practice speech-language pathology OR occupational therapy OR physiotherapy in the province of Québec; (4) two years of clinical practice, preferably with a pediatric population. Prior experience with young multiply handicapped children in a school context would be valuable preparation for this position. Prior experience supervising or teaching pre-professional students would also be an asset. The successful candidate will be appointed on a contractual basis for an 9-month term at the rank of Professional Associate.

The responsibilities of the Professional Associate will be to work with faculty and staff in the Schools of Communication Sciences and Disorders and Physical and Occupational Therapy to develop a new interprofessional intervention for children that will serve as a clinical affiliation opportunity for our professional students. Tasks during the development phase of this project will include (1) negotiating partnership agreements with community agencies willing to host the intervention program; (2) developing a referral and pre-screening system for recruiting children to participate in the intervention; (3) assisting with the development of curriculum and training materials for students and clinical educators; (4) obtaining materials and equipment. Tasks during the implementation phase will include recruiting and screening potential participants for the intervention and supervising professional students in the implementation of the intervention.

Applications will be accepted until January 5<sup>th</sup> or until the position is filled.
