

Instructor needed for GEOG 495 Field Studies – Physical Geography

An instructor is sought to teach GEOG 495 in the summer session. This course teaches students how to conduct field studies in physical geography. Held locally in Monteregian or Eastern Township regions from May 15 – June, 2017, usually at McGill's Gault Research Centre at Mont Saint-Hilaire (MSH). The course is organised around field projects designed to formulate and test scientific hypotheses in a physical geography discipline.

The instructor of GEOG 495 is responsible for designing and executed a field studies education program over a two week period including the demonstration of field techniques with standard equipment used in physical geography field work; the preparation, with the assistance of the departmental technician, of all the equipment to be used by the students; the design of course assignments to be done in the field to help steps develop their practical field skills; and then supervision and grading of student's field projects. The instructor will a teaching assistant, if numbers warrant, to assist with field demonstrations, project supervision, and grading as required.

Salary: \$7,800.00

Qualifications: Senior PhD student or PhD in physical geography or related field. Most show evidence of extensive of practical experience with field studies in physical geography.

The University may, at its discretion, assign the person of its choice to give this Course/Teaching.
