Who works on food security at the OECD?



Development Cooperation Directorate:

- Tracks aid flows including to agriculture, aid for trade...
- Lead role in monitoring L'Aquila commitments
- Fosters best practice - Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness
- Promotes international dialogue on aid architecture (governance)

Trade and Agriculture Directorate:

- Monitors agricultural policies in OECD and some non-OECD
- Undertakes analysis to inform policy choice:
 - Agriculture
 - Trade (including aid for trade)
 - Development

Joint work on food security, aid for trade and aid effectiveness...



Improving food security in the short run

Short term responses to 2007-08 price spikes impressive:

- **WFP gets high marks:**
 - quickly mobilized resources
 - local procurement proved effective and complementary to development
 - lessons learned on best practice and potential for better targeting
- **High Level Task Force:**
 - fostered coherent response from international organizations
 - promoted high profile dialogue
- **Rapid scaling up of financing by IO's (new initiatives at FAO, World Bank, IFAD, EU...)**

Responses by some countries unhelpful, even if understandable

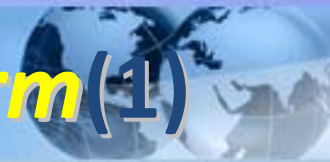


Improving food security in medium term



Increase ag productivity/output in developing countries:

- **Additional funding for public goods: research, extension, market information, infrastructure, institution building...**
 - Address market failures
 - Commit funds to activities that generate sustainable results
 - Recognize diversity of situations across and within countries
- **Promote ag trade reform, develop trading capacity**
 - Open markets so competitive suppliers respond to global price signals
 - Reduce distortions to global markets due to ag support policy (OECD &)
 - Implement Aid for Trade Initiative to boost capacity and infrastructure
 - Improve coherence between trade and development policies

« **Viewing long run food insecurity as poverty**



Enlarges and re-orientes portfolio of policy choice

- Agriculture and trade policy will continue to feature
- But also wider framework and policies that:
 - *recognizes inclusive economic growth as only sustainable cure*
 - *promote pro-poor income opportunities both on and off farm*
 - *foster adjustment and transition out of farming (faster than ever)*
 - *focus on outcomes, not agents (e.g., small-holders)*
 - *ensure social protection for the most vulnerable*

Summing up:

- Short term responses to successive waves of crises impressive - important lessons learned
- In the medium term focus on policy & market failures, socially profitable public investments in agriculture
- Long run policy agenda more than just agriculture

Best policy 'mix' depends both on the length of run and stage of development
