## Reminder: Residency Requirements

- All LL.M. programs require <u>three full-time terms of residence</u> (fall, winter & summer terms)
- You are expected to reside in Montreal
- Full fees are charged for each of the three full-time terms
- All students are expected to be registered and pay fees for the academic year up to and including the term of graduation
- If the thesis or research project, under exceptional circumstances, is not completed within the three terms of residency, students must register for additional sessions – with fees

# Summer 2016 Registration opens **Thursday**, **March 10, 2016**

- Non-Thesis students: Third term of residency must be in summer term unless previously approved by GPO
- Very limited course options; Consult with GPO ASAP if you are concerned about meeting credit requirements

# Summer 2016 Registration - Steps

- Add on Minerva:
  - Research courses (thesis/non-thesis)
  - Any outstanding course credits (limited options)
  - ➤ (<u>Thesis</u>): **REGN STOR** (CRN **857**) *Conf. Summer Term of Residence*
  - > (Non-Thesis): Apply to graduate by April 6, 2016
- To remain in full-time status, you must be registered for a minimum of 12 credits per term

## Thesis Submission

• 3 submission deadlines per year: **Aug. 15, Dec. 15 & April 15** (no extension granted)

## Steps

- 1. Initial ethesis submission (e-mail submission to GPS with relevant forms)
- 2. Thesis evaluation & revision
- Final ethesis submission (on Minerva)
- The timing of initial submission determines the <u>registration and fee</u> <u>status</u> for the following term, whereas the timing of **final** submission determines the <u>graduation date</u>

- Thesis students: Final ethesis submission by August 15, 2016 is required in order to avoid additional fees

   Fall 2016 registration will start in April.
