



NEUROPATHOLOGY PHYSICIAN-SCIENTIST AND DIRECTOR OF MOLECULAR PATHOLOGY MCGILL UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTRE/MONTREAL NEUROLOGICAL INSTITUTE AND HOSPITAL

The Department of Pathology at McGill University Health Centre and Montreal Neurological Institute and Hospital are seeking a Full time Neuropathology physician-scientist and Director of Molecular Pathology. The successful candidate will be appointed in the Department of Pathology, cross-appointed in the Department of Neurology and Neurosurgery and will be housed in the Montreal Neurological Institute and Hospital. The anticipated start of the position is July 2015.

Candidate must be certified in Neuropathology by the Royal College of Physician and Surgeon of Canada, or have an appropriate level of speciality training in Neuropathology for licensure in Quebec. Responsibilities will include: (1) participation in all aspects of diagnostic and teaching activities; (2) administration of the molecular pathology unit in the pathology department. Here, knowledge and experience in the clinical application of next generation sequencing would be an asset; (3) establishing and running an externally funded independent research program. We welcome applicants with research interests from all areas of neuroscience.

The Neuropathology service at the MNH handles around 1400 surgical specimens per year, including 150 muscle and nerve biopsies, and approximately 150 autopsies including neurodegenerative cases from an affiliated brain bank. Members of Neuropathology service participate in university departmental teaching, including undergraduate and graduate student teaching, teaching of medical students as well as supervision of graduate students, residents and post-doctoral fellows. They also take on administrative tasks as university and hospital committee.

McGill University is committed to diversity and equity in employment. All qualified applicants are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.
