Position Description

The Department of Psychiatry at McGill University is currently inviting applications for a full-time position as a member of the Contract Academic Staff at the Assistant Professor (Clinical) level. This will be a three-year, renewable appointment.

The successful candidate will have a broad range of clinical abilities in second and third line adult outpatient psychiatry, particularly in mood and anxiety disorders. The applicant will also have an academic track record, demonstrated by a research dossier and/or experience in education. The candidate will be appointed to clinical practice at the Douglas Institute.

The Douglas Institute is part of the *Centre intégré universitaire de santé et de services sociaux (CIUSSS) de l'Ouest-de-l'Île-de-Montréal* whose mission is to offer cutting-edge care and advance and share knowledge in mental health. Job Duties

Applicants should have training (Fellowship/MD/Graduate Studies) and the capacity to engage in all aspects of a university affiliated psychiatry department (clinical, education, research). Successful candidates will provide excellent clinical teaching and supervision to residents and medical students, and expected to pursue scholarly activities.

Qualifications and Education Requirements

The candidate must hold or be eligible for licensure as a psychiatrist in the province of Quebec. Clinician-scientists with MD-PhD are encouraged.
