The TRAM (Transformational
Research in Adolescent Mental
Health) is a Canada-wide, five
year and \$25 M initiative jointly
funded by the Canadian
Institutes of Health Research
(CIHR) and the Graham
BoeckhFoundation (GBF).



The project's goal is to use research evidence to bring about positive changes to the way we care for youths (age 11 to 25) with mental health problems. The vision of the network proposed by Dr. Malla and his team is encompassed in its name (ACCESS): Adolescent/young adult Connections to Community-driven, Early, Strengths-based and Stigmafree services.

Congratulations to Dr. Brett Thombs who is the recipient of the 2014 Principal's prize for

The Dr. Samarthji Lal Award recognizes a Canadian researcher who is mid-career and making an outstanding contribution to the field of psychiatry. Dr. Turecki will also direct the newly created Centre for Translational Research on Mood Disorders and Suicide. The \$9.8 million center was created with contributions from the Ministry and from the Douglas Foundation. The announcement of the \$7.2M contribution from the Ministry for the development of the center was made by the Minister of Health and Social Services at a ceremony held at the Douglas last February.

There will be leadership transitions this fall as Dr. Karl Looper takes on his new role as Chief at the Jewish General Hospital and steps down as the Residency Program Director. Dr. Looper has done an outstanding job as Program Director. During his tenure, he expanded the program to encompass a resident research track, rural training rotations in northern Quebec and aboriginal communities, and created new subspecialty training opportunities in our department. The Program integrated new Royal College requirements for level-based clinical training and underwent a successful Royal College accreditation. The

surprise party organized by the residents on June 12th (and he was definitely surprised!) is perhaps the best tribute to Dr. Looper's positive impact on our residency program and the learning environment. The search to fill the Program Director position is ongoing, and we hope to make an announcement soon.

We also welcome new leaders to our education mission: Dr. Emmanuelle Levy has been appointed as the new Undergraduate Site Director at the Douglas replacing Dr. Hani Iskandar; Dr. Toby Measham as Training Director at the MCH replacing Dr. Lara Stern; and Dr. Daniel Zigman

has been appointed as Chair of the newly created Evaluations and Promotions Committee for the Postgraduate Education Program. We extend our thanks to Hani and Lara for their very valuable contributions to their respective programs.

Our application for recognition of subspecialty training in Geriatric Psychiatry has just been submitted. We extend our deepest thanks to Dr. Jess Friedland for spearheading the effort, and look forward to a positive response from the Royal College in the fall.

This summer marked the 20th anniversary of our annual Summer Program in Social and Cultural Psychiatry. The program has expanded to 12 courses, workshops and conferences and this year we inaugurated new courses on *Social and Community Psychiatry* and *The Use of Film in Cultural Psychiatry*.

The Advanced Study Institute this year was on "The Politics of Diversity: Pluralism Multiculturalism and Mental Health." The theme was especially timely because of the recent debates over the Charter of Quebec Values and we were glad to have staff from the office of our new Minister of Immigration,

Diversity and Inclusiveness in attendance.

The Summer Program is an exciting time when we feel a strong sense of our own community of colleagues and students and enjoy the recognition by visitors that we have a unique program. Over the years, more than 600 participants have taken the graduate course in Cultural Psychiatry.

At the RUIS level, we have almost completed a Directory of Services that will list all specialized services offered by our teaching hospitals. Once finalized, the directory will be translated and uploaded to our website and will allow our partners to obtain detailed information on the type of services offered and how to access them. The list will be organized by programs, sites, diagnoses and age groups for easy navigation. My personal thanks to our RUIS committee and the site chiefs for the time and effort they gave to the project. Representatives from our RUIS Mental Health Committee also presented a workshop on the use of telehealth in service delivery in the great north at the McGill RUIS symposium held in Rouyn-Noranda in May. The workshop was attended by several of our partners who praised our efforts to provide culturally-sensitive services adapted to the mental health needs of the Cree and Inuit people. My thanks to Michele Larose, Janique Harvey and Charles-Edouard Carrier who helped me develop and present the workshop.

I am pleased to note increasing interest of our faculty to apply for promotion. This past spring, seven promotions dossiers were submitted for review at the Spring Promotions Committee meeting and we've already received news that they have been approved by the Faculty of Medicine. Although official announcements can only be made after final approval by the Provost, we look forward to announcing two promotions to Full Professor and five to Associate Professor soon. For those interested in applying for promotion, please note that the next deadline for dossier submission is August 15th.

On the administrative front, we introduced benchmarks

which were used as a guideline for the performance evaluation exercise this year. The Annual Activities Report was also revamped and designed in such a way that it will provide backup for the self-report and evaluation exercise, and can be used to keep track of activities for eventual promotion, reappointment and other academic reporting.

In closing, as I reflect on my seven years as Chair, I emerge positive and optimistic about our future. It has been a privilege to lead this vibrant, eclectic, multitalented department. Throughout my mandate, I have been touched by the support and trust of my colleagues; we faced many challenges together, and did so with creativity, humor and resilience.
