Faculty of Arts

Graduate Certificate in Digital Archives Management (15 cr.) – Appendix A

At a meeting on 26th February 2015, APC reviewed and approved a proposal to create a Graduate Certificate in Digital Archives Management, which aims at preparing students to work in the area of digital archives. Courses focus on principles of organization of information, practices in archival studies, strategies for digital curation and enterprise content management. This is an entry level Graduate Program that may lead to another Graduate Certificate or to the M.I.St. program.

Graduate Certificate in Information and Knowledge Management (15 cr.) – Appendix B At a meeting on 26th February 2015, APC reviewed and approved a proposal to create a Graduate Certificate in Information and Knowledge Management, responding to the growing demand for information professionals and knowledge managers in various sectors. This is an entry level Graduate Program that may lead to another Graduate Certificate or to the M.I.St. program.

Faculty of Arts

M.I.St.; Non-Thesis; Project (48 cr.)

This new concentration will allow students to develop professional skills and more indepth research competencies than the M.I.St. program, responding to the growing interest amongst students to do research and to the growing expectation amongst employers that information professionals be able to conduct research in various settings.

M.S.W; Non-Thesis; Gender and Women's Studies (45 cr.)

This graduate option in Gender and Women's Studies is an interdisciplinary program for students who meet the requirements in Social Work and wish to take six credits of approved coursework to focus on gender, sexuality, feminist and women's studies and issues in feminist research and methods.

ii. Major revisions of existing programs

Faculty of Arts

M.I.St.; Non-Thesis (48 cr.)

The M.I.St.; Non-Thesis program is designed to prepare graduate for the broad field of information studies. The program had to be split in two streams following the creation of the M.I.St.; Non-Thesis; Project program, which prevents students from applying for a FQRSC fellowship, unlike the M.I.St.; Non-Thesis program.

M.A.; Classics; Non-Thesis (45 cr.)

APC approved a request from the Classics Program to re-activate its M.A. program (Non-Thesis). The program was re-structured and aligned with GPS norms. The program offers advanced training in the scholarly discipline of classical studies in a variety of fields, is

designed for students who need to strengthen their proficiency in ancient languages and other aspects of classical studies, and places greater emphasis on graduate coursework.
