• Aboriginal Health Fellowship (Deadline: March 10, 2014)

Bri'ut (meaning 'health' or 'wellness' in Hebrew) is a health promotion program which has been developed for indigenous populations. The program's goal is to improve the long term health of Aboriginal populations by strengthening local capacity for health promotion and the delivery of community based health promotion programs. These programs are developed within the context of local knowledge and expertise. By partnering with Aboriginal communities, Ve'ahavta can help support the development of health promotion programs which are mindful and respectful of local environments. Master-level graduate students (Public Health or Social Work) will be placed in the Kenora, Ontario region for a 4-month placement beginning in May 2014.

Students will work closely with local health teams and stakeholders to help in identifying health promotion needs as expressed by communities, and to assist in supporting community-driven health initiatives and health program strategies through collaboration, participation and community action.

EBSCO, the vendor, describes this database as follows: *Abstracts in Social Gerontology* includes bibliographic records covering essential areas related to social gerontology, including the psychology of aging, elder abuse, society and the elderly, and other key areas of relevance to the discipline. The index contains more than 35,700 records, which are carefully selected from the most important sources within the discipline, such as: *Journals of Gerontology Series, American Journal of Geriatric Psychiatry, Experimental Gerontology*, etc. EBSCO has digitized the full archive of this index, bringing coverage back to 1990.

2014 Arts Undergraduate Research Awards (ARIA) (Deadline: Thursday, March 24, 2014)

The Arts Internship Office is pleased to announce the launch of the Arts Undergraduate Research Internship Awards (ARIA) Summer 2014. Established by Dean Christopher P. Manfredi in 2010, the purpose of the Arts Undergraduate Research Internship Award (ARIA) is to support undergraduate students who undertake research during the summer under the direct supervision of a faculty member. Students contribute to the professor's research agenda while gaining useful academic research skills.

For summer 2014, the Faculty of Arts will provide undergraduate Research Internship Awards, each with a value \$2000. These awards are matched by individual faculty members or their departments to provide a total award of \$4000 to the student.

In the first three years of the program, a total of 120 awards were disbursed to students in nearly every department and program in the Faculty. The students engaged in a high level of scholarship, enhancing their research skills and knowledge of their fields, and received mentorship from their supervising professors. • Graduate Student Teaching Awards (Deadline: Thursday, March 27, 2014)

The **Faculty of Arts Graduate Student Teaching Awards** are designed to recognize outstanding teaching in the Faculty by graduate students, and will be awarded at the April Faculty meeting. All full-time Arts graduate students in good standing who are Teaching Assistants or Course Lecturers are eligible for this award, and any student or member of the academic staff may submit a nomination. Three awards of \$500 each will be made. Thoughtful and detailed letters of nomination carry greater weight in the selection process than mere numbers of nominations.

H. Noel Fieldhouse Award for Distinguished Teaching (Deadline: Thursday, March 27th, 2014)

The H. Noel Fieldhouse Award for Distinguished Teaching is designed to recognize outstanding teaching in the Faculty of Arts, and is awarded each June at Convocation. All full-time academic staff in the Faculty of Arts are eligible for this award. Any student, alumnus, or member of the academic staff may submit a nomination. The Arts Prizes and Awards Committee requires for each nominee:

• the completed nomination form

- at least one nominating letter from a current or former undergraduate student
- at least one nominating letter from a fellow faculty member

Thoughtful and detailed letters of nomination carry greater weight in the selection process than mere numbers of nominations. All types of teaching, from very large lectures to seminars, tutorials, and thesis direction, should be taken into consideration.
