- University of Zürich (Universität Zürich)

At a meeting on 24<sup>th</sup> May 2012, APC reviewed and approved a proposal for a student exchange agreement with the University of Zürich that will be limited to undergraduate students, but may be expanded to include graduate students upon renewal, should all parties support the expansion. Partnership with the University of Zürich was proposed and supported by the Department of Political Science. It builds on links that already exist between the Centre for the Study of Democratic Citizenship of which McGill is a member and the National Centre of Competence in Research (NCCR)-Democracy of the University of Zürich and provides good opportunities for new collaborations. The Department of Political Science of the University of Zürich typically offers about twenty courses in English that deal with topics likely to be of interest to McGill students. Universität Zürich, one of the leading research universities in Europe, was founded in 1833, although its origins stretch back as far as 1525 and the days of protestant reformer Ulrich Zwingli. Universität Zürich, Switzerland's largest university (26,000 students), is a member of the "League of European Research Universities" (LERU), an association of twenty-one leading research-intensive universities that share the values of high-quality teaching within an environment of internationally competitive research. Faculties include: Arts, Science, Theology, Medicine, Veterinary Medicine, Law, and Economics, Business Administration and Information Technology.
