Desautels Faculty of Management

B.Com.; General Management; Information Systems; Digital Innovation (15 cr.)

At a meeting on 11th December 2014, APC reviewed and approved a proposal for a B.Com.; General Management; Information Systems; Digital Innovation. This new concentration responds to a high demand from students for more integrated courses on digital innovation whose offerings respond to ongoing and long term changes in the management workforce. This option is offered alongside the IT for business option within the concentration in Information Systems, and will provide students with the skills and knowledge necessary to navigate the complex process of digital innovation.

ii. Major revisions of existing programs

Desautels Faculty of Management

B.Com.; General Management; Information Systems; IT for business (15 cr.)

At a meeting on 11th December 2014, APC reviewed and approved a proposal for an IT for Business option within the Information Systems concentration in the B.Com in General Management. It is one of the two options offered in this concentration, and is an ideal complement to the majors and concentrations offered in other areas. It emphasizes the importance of the interrelationships across technology, management and strategy, and aims at training effective leaders, users and managers of IT.

M.Eng.; Biological and Biomedical Engineering (45 cr.)

At a meeting on 11th December 2014, APC reviewed and approved a proposal from the Faculty of Medicine and the Faculty of Engineering to rename the existing M.Eng. in Biomedical Engineering and the Ph.D. in Biomedical Engineering to M.Eng. in Biological and Biomedical Engineering and Ph.D in Biological and Biomedical Engineering. These changes of name formalize a new extended partnership between Biomedical Engineering and the Bioengineering Departments, through which they will be able to provide students with interdisciplinary graduate training and to expand areas of research and collaborations.

Creation of a Global designation for the B.Sc.

At a meeting on 11th December 2014, APC reviewed and approved the creation of a B.Sc. Global designation, recognizing students who have gone beyond the requirement of a B.Sc. and have broadened their horizons by including language courses, independent research, global-related study and/non-McGill study or work experience in their program. Eligible students will

have the mention B.Sc. Global Designation added to their student record and transcript at graduation. Requirements to be eligible include 3 credits of both language and research courses as well as either 6 credits of approved field study courses, 6 credits of McGill courses with a substantial Global component or one term as an exchange student in an university outside of Montreal.
