School of Continuing Studies

Professional Development Certificate in Project Management (32.5-44.5 CEUs) – Appendix A

At a meeting on 16th April 2015, APC reviewed and approved the proposal for the creation of a Professional Development Certificate in Project Management aiming at providing professionals with the knowledge and skills necessary to successfully manage projects of various nature and scale. The demand for Project Management education is growing, and this non-credit Professional Development Certificate will provide the School of Continuing Studies with a definite edge over the growing competition in the field of Project Management Education, as there is currently no such program offered in English in Montreal.

Faculty-wide partnerships

At a meeting on 16th April 2015, APC reviewed and approved a proposal that McGill enter into faculty-wide student exchange agreements with the following institutions:

Università Di Roma, Sapienza, Rome, Italy

Sapienza University of Rome is one of the oldest universities in Europe that has played an important role in Italian history and has been directly involved in key changes and developments in society, economics and politics. It has contributed to the development of Italian and European Science and culture in all areas of knowledge. McGill currently has seven partnerships with Italian universities, but only the University of Bologna is open to all McGill students at this time, and this partnership will help respond to a demand that currently cannot be met.

Durham University, Durham, UK

Durham is a residential collegiate university with long traditions and modern values. Its main functions are divided between the academic departments of the university and its 16 colleges. In general, the departments perform research and provide lectures to students while the colleges are responsible for the domestic arrangements and the welfare of students, post-doctoral researchers and some university staff. There is a growing demand from McGill students to study in the UK, and Durham University will offer them a unique opportunity to spend one year in a residential collegiate style university, modelled on Oxford and Cambridge.

According to the Project Management Institute's (PMI)® Project Management Talent Gap Report, double-digit growth (more than 12 percent) in demand for project management professionals is expected between 2010 and 2020, resulting in almost 6.2 million jobs in 2020 globally. McGill SCS is proposing to introduce a non-credit Professional Development Certificate in Project Management that will provide SCS with a distinct competitive edge over the growing competition in the field of Project Management education, as currently there is no Project Management Certificate offered in English in Montreal. This new program will help attract new students seeking a certificate in Project Management, will motivate existing students to complete more than one course, and will encourage graduates to return to McGill to earn a Project Management certificate. The CPD Department reviews, revises or retires any existing programs that are obsolete or have low enrolment. **Admission Requirements:** Applicants must hold a Quebec CEGEP diploma (DEC, DCS or equivalent of one year of full-time university studies [30 credits]), or be at least 21 years of age in order to be admitted as a mature student.

This program is offered in English and must be completed within 2 years.


