Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies/ Faculty of Education Graduate Certificate in International Leadership in Educational and Administrative Development (15 cr.) - Appendix A

At a meeting on November 17th 2016, APC reviewed and approved a proposal from Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies and the Faculty of Education to create a Graduate Certificate in International Leadership in Educational and Administrative Development. This Graduate Certificate has been designed for leaders, policy makers, administrators and consultants from a wide range of organizations and aims at providing them with experience in educational leadership. Most of the courses will be delivered online during the academic year and be completed by an intensive summer component on the McGill campus. This is a self-funded program that will attract students internationally and offer even more visibility to the Faculty of Education on the ever-changing global market.

APC therefore recommends that Senate approve the following resolution:

Be it resolved that Senate approve the proposed Graduate Certificate in International Leadership in Educational and Administrative Development.

School of Continuing Studies

Professional Development Certificate in Parliamentary Management (18 CEUs) – Appendix B

At a meeting on November 17th 2016, APC reviewed and approved a proposal from the School of Continuing Studies to create a new Professional Development Certificate in Parliamentary Management. Following the successful creation of a unique non-credit/non-transcript Parliamentary Staff program, launched in collaboration with the World Bank 5 years ago, the School of Continuing Studies is now proposing to offer this Professional Development Certificate, aimed at mid-level Parliamentary Staff who wish to further their careers. This program, based on international best practices will be unique in Quebec and Canada where no certificate is currently offered in English to the administrative staff of Parliament.

The Graduate Certificate in International Leadership in Educational and Administrative Development (I-LEAD) targets leaders, consultants, senior management and administrators and policy makers from a range of educational institutions (universities, colleges, private schools) and organizations (hospitals, community, governmental), as well as the corporate sector. The goal is to provide a world-class global training experience in educational leadership. The majority of the courses will be delivered online asynchronously, with students accessing learning material and participating in online discussions. Courses are offered online during the fall, spring, and winter semesters. There will be an intensive summer component on the McGill campus.

There is a clear distinction between the focus and purpose of the existing Leadership certificates and the new I-LEAD. In Canada, Education is a provincial jurisdiction. As stated in the program description, the existing certificates address the preparation of leaders for the Quebec context. The certificates' focus, curriculum, and administrative and leadership policies reflect this orientation. Individuals in the Quebec school system seeking positions as school administrators are required to complete graduate studies in Leadership, and these certificates respond to this need.

The new I-LEAD will not focus on the Quebec context. Its goal, rather (as stated in the description) is "to provide a world-class global training experience in educational leadership". It will target professionals aiming to strengthen their knowledge of Educational and Administrative Development in an international context.

This 15-credit program addresses the needs of experienced and aspiring school leaders who are taking increased responsibility for the students and communities they serve. TOEFL:iBT (Internet-based test) - total score of 92 with a minimum score of 22 each for the Writing and Speaking sections and a minimum of 20 each for the Reading and Listening sections and PBT (paper-based test) - 580.
