PARTICIPANTS WILL ADDRESS THE GROWING IMPORTANCE OF HOSPITAL-BASED MEDICINE AND SPECIALIST HOSPITAL DESIGN; THE POLITICS AND CULTURE OF "NATIONAL REGENERATION"; THE EVOLUTION OF ASYLUMS; RESPONSES TO TUBERCULOSIS; AND CHANGING IDEAS ABOUT THE MEDICINAL QUALITIES OF HOSPITAL AND ASYLUM LANDSCAPES.
