

INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITY WITH THE 78TH FRASER HIGHLANDERS SUMMER 2021

POSITION:	Intern
LOCATION:	Montreal, QC (may be remote – based on public health guidelines)
DESCRIPTION OF HOST ORGANIZATION:	The 78th Fraser Highlanders is a not for profit historical association which conducts research on the Highland soldiers of the Seven Years' War in North America, many of whom stayed or came back to Canada and the USA in the late 18th century. These soldiers formed the foundation of the Scottish community in Canada. The association has extensive archives, no paid staff but access to professional archivists and historians. This group initiated this research more than 50 years ago.
INTERN'S DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Indexing of archival documents and conducting research. - Making data entries (FileMaker Pro) on the soldiers as found in the archives by the interns and the other researchers/historians, which will be web accessible. - Assist with public information requests based on this regiment and period. <p><i>Interns' duties and projects may not be as listed. These will depend on the needs of the host organization.</i></p>
HOST ORGANIZATION'S REQUIREMENTS:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Student in history or with knowledge and interest in Canadian history. - Excellent communication skills. - Ability to work independently. - Excellent interpersonal skills. - Good organizational and research skills. - Knowledge of MS Office (Word, Outlook, Excel). - Experience in the museum sector or with museum volunteers and volunteering an asset. - Student will need to bring their own laptop.
HOURS:	12 weeks (25 hours a week)
DATES:	May to August – tbd with supervisor
REMUNERATION:	\$4,500 CAD issued to the intern through a Faculty of Arts Internship Award

DEADLINE TO APPLY:	February 15, 2021. 12:00pm noon EST.
ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:	<p>Interns are responsible for informing themselves of what entry requirements are required to visit and work as an intern in the internship host country. These may include a visa, work permit, passport valid for at least 6 months after entry, and proof of certain vaccinations.</p> <p><u>The intern is responsible for acquiring all necessary documents in time for the beginning of their internship.</u></p>
ELIGIBILITY:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - McGill Faculty of Arts students (B.A., B.A & Sc., BSW, B.Th., M.A, MSW) completed 60 credits - Minimum CGPA of 2.7 - Returning to McGill in the fall semester following the internship - Students must fulfill Faculty of Arts requirements as outlined in the Handbook for Interns https://www.mcgill.ca/arts-internships/resources
COSTS:	The intern is responsible for all costs associated with the internship including transportation, accommodations, etc.

TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS:	Preparing travel arrangements to and from the internship host organization is the responsibility of the intern.
ACCOMMODATION:	Finding suitable lodging during the internship is the responsibility of the intern.

Only short-listed candidates will be contacted. At that time, you may be asked to come in for an interview.

The Arts Internship Office will then transmit the selected applications to the host organization, who will ultimately be responsible for the selection of the candidate(s).
