LOCATION:	Montreal, QC. Hybrid internship: intern is expected to be at the host organization office location (with a specified number of days in the office determined by the host organization.
DESCRIPTION OF HOST ORGANIZATION:	The <u>Canadian Federation of Friends of Museums</u> (CFFM), established in 1977, is a national non-for-profit organization with its central offices in Montreal, that represents the thousands of volunteers who generously commit their time and their expertise to support museums and heritage sites across Canada. Our registered charity's mission is to promote and support volunteers through our resource hub, as well educate the public about the value of museums and of preserving Canadian heritage. Our newly formed Young Friends Council (YF) is active in engaging young people in Canadian cultural heritage and organizes hybrid networking events for youth aged 18 to 30. The CFFM is also the spokesperson for Canadian volunteers on the international stage as members of the World Federation of Friends of Museums (WFFM).

Undertake the research, the writing, and the editing of our monthly digital newsletter on volunteer management, "Volunteer Voices" and summer edition of "Au Courant" (volunteer bulletin) Update our website and assist in developing our social media campaign. Carry out regular office administrative tasks Participate in outreach and event coordination for Young Friends network (YF). Assist in coordinating meetings and meeting minutes of the CFFM Board of Directors. Interns' duties and projects may not all be as listed. These will depend on the needs of the host organization.
