

## Differences between a CV & a Cover Letter

CV

Cover Letter

- No full sentences
- Only about you

- Only full sentences
- Conveys your interest in the company/organization
- Illustrates clearly how your qualifications match the requirements (connect the dots for the reader)

#### **Persuasive Cover Letters**

- The angle of your letter: how you would be valuable to the organization
- Explicitly state similarities between your qualifications and the open position by using comparison transitional words
- Include details

- your interest in the field of the internship
- you understand the mission of the organization
- clearly the connection between your qualifications and the requirements of the internship
- key words from the internship posting
- correct spelling and grammar

## 3 Strategies for Customizing your Cover Letter to Specific Internships

- 1. Use key words from the internship posting
- 2. Mention the name of the organization's projects, programs, initiatives, events etc. in relation to your qualifications
- 3. Connect your qualifications with the requirements of the internship



#### Strategy #1

#### Use Key Words from the Internship Posting

- Any words that are repeated
- All acronyms
- Words that are capitalized
- Any words you think are key words

Start with the Qualifications/Requirements section of the posting 2nd look at the Responsibilities section of the posting



#### HOST ORGANIZATION REQUIREMENTS:

Excellent verbal and written communication skills in French and English are necessary. Must be able to facilitate trainings and do follow-up with partners in French.

- University studies in a relevant field: political science, education, psychology, and/or other social sciences
- Interest in programing aimed at empowering youth and increasing their social participation
- Commitment to the promotion of human rights, social justice and equity
- Interest, academic and/or professional experience in one or many of the following areas is an asset:
  human rights education, anti-racism, working with BIPOC, newcomer or refugee youth, engaging
  decision makers on matters relating to inclusivity, discrimination and SDGs (sustainable
  development goals), Indigenous cultures, LGBTQI+ rights, gender-based, intersectional and traumainformed approaches, anti-oppression and decolonizing practices.
- Must be an autonomous self-starter with strong organizational skills
- Must be capable and willing to work collaboratively even in an online setting within multiple working teams
- Computer literacy in database management and Microsoft applications is an asset
- Experience working with children and youth, preferably in a non-formal setting such as camps,
   youth clubs, etc. is an asset

#### 5 WORDS TO AVOID

WHEN WRITING A COVER LETTER

DREAM LOVE HOPE

THINK BELIEVE



"I believe my qualifications fit your current needs."

VS.

"My qualifications such as 3 years' experience in marketing fits your current needs."



#### Transitional Words to Use

WHEN WRITING A COVER LETTER

THEREFORE AS A RESULT SIMILARLY

IN THE SAME WAY LIKEWISE ALSO



#### **Cover Letter Outline**

BEGINNING – the reason why you are sending a cover letter

MIDDLE – comparing/matching (persuasively) the requirements and your qualifications (connecting the dots for the reader)

END – Call to action
Examples:
Ask for a meeting (virtual or in-person)
or
Ask for a phone call

- Grammarly a free extension for your browser that corrects spelling, grammar, punctuation, and sentence structure.
- MerciApp looks, feels, and functions very much like Grammarly, but for French.
- Microsoft Word and pages both offer an Outline View that helps you jot down keywords, organize them into a structure and reorganize them into a coherent document.
- · Activate more grammar checking features within Microsoft Word.
- Word365 offers the "ideas" tab that can help refine your writing by highlighting issues of clarity, conciseness, and conventions.
- A free 30-day demo version of WordQ is available for download. This software allows a text-to-speech readout of the work you have written. It can help you hear certain syntax errors and identify unclear or wordy sentences. The Word Prediction feature helps you minimize spelling errors and may increase typing output by reducing the number of keystrokes necessary to type words.
- · Cordial French grammar corrector.
- . BonPatron Helps you correct your French texts.
