

## INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITY WITH Institute for Human Development and Well-Being (McGill) SUMMER 2021

<b>POSITION:</b>	Three Summer Research Interns
<b>LOCATION:</b>	Montreal, QC, Canada (remote)
<b>DESCRIPTION OF HOST ORGANIZATION:</b>	<p>The Institute for Human Development and Well-Being (IHDW) is a transdisciplinary unit led by McGill's Faculty of Education. The IHDW draws together researchers from McGill's Departments of Family Medicine, Educational and Counselling Psychology, Integrated Studies in Education, Anthropology, Kinesiology and Physical Education, Psychiatry, the School of Urban Planning, the School of Social Work, and the Faculty of Dentistry. <b>INTERN'S DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:</b>	<p>This internship will be a unique blend of community arts programming and general support for the up-and-coming Institute for Human Development and Well-being. Many of the activities are projected to take place online through digital communication means with community members and IHDW personnel, bearing in mind the safety measures consistent with McGill University and the Province's mandates regarding Covid-19.</p> <p>Creative applicants encouraged to apply. We are looking for Faculty of Arts students passionate about human development and well-being to join our eight to twelve week internship program. As a Summer Research Intern you will learn the ins and outs of what goes into research development, social media, event planning, and drafting proposals.</p> <p>Many of our projects focus on gender-based violence prevention, promoting and strengthening child and teen agency, and the use of Participatory Visual Methods in these endeavours . Interns lead and participate in a range of activities including funding development, leadership programs, social events and mentoring among others.</p> <p><i>Interns' duties and projects may not be as listed. These will depend on the needs of the host organization.</i></p>
