



## INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITY WITH SAPA O'CHAU SOCIAL ENTERPRISE - VIETNAM SUMMER 2019

POSITION:	Internship at Sapa O'Chau Social Enterprise for ethnic minority youth education and
	vocational training.
LOCATION:	Sa Pa town, Lào Cai province, in the northern rural uplands of Vietnam.
DESCRIPTION OF HOST ORGANIZATION:  INTERN'S DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:	Sapa O'Chau is committed to providing educational, employment and other livelihood opportunities to ethnic minority groups in Sapa town and the surrounding Muong Hoa valley. The organization was the dream of founder Shu Tan, an ethnic minority Hmong woman from nearby Lao Chai village. In addition to a Training Centre aimed at getting ethnic minority youth back to school and into careers, Sapa O'Chau operates a Café and a Trekking and Homestay business committed to responsible tourism. The Sapa O'Chau family includes a wide range of partners and volunteers from within Sapa and Vietnam, but also from numerous countries around the world. <a href="http://sapaochau.org/">http://sapaochau.org/</a> The intern's duties are likely to change on a daily or weekly basis (so flexibility is a must!). The duties will generally be related to:
	<ul> <li>Assisting Volunteer Coordinator with volunteer management.</li> <li>Helping teach students English, or skills related to hospitality management.</li> <li>Creating training materials/curriculum for student training.</li> <li>Maintaining/updating the Sapa O'Chau website.</li> <li>Creating promotional materials for Sapa O'Chau.</li> <li>Translating and/or proofreading materials.</li> <li>Interns' duties and projects may not be as listed. These will depend on the needs of the host organization.</li> </ul>
HOST ORGANIZATION'S	- Ideal for a student in International Development Studies, Anthropology or
REQUIREMENTS:	<ul> <li>Human Geography (as part of BA), however all students with a demonstrated interest in supporting grassroots community development and/or ethnic minority rights should apply</li> <li>Language proficiency in English, basic Vietnamese would be an asset but is not essential</li> <li>Ability to work with minimal supervision; be extremely flexible; be willing to try new tasks and not get frustrated if tasks change.</li> <li>Basic computer skills: MS Word, Excel and ability to use social media.</li> <li>Website design software knowledge (esp. open source) would be helpful.</li> <li>Comfortable working in an English-as-a-second language environment.</li> <li>Interest in community development and minority rights.</li> <li>Prior experience working or living in a developing country would be an asset.</li> <li>Ability to work / live with some inconveniencies (i.e. periodic power outages, slow internet connections).</li> <li>Usually a police check [Certificate of good conduct] is required, as interns will be working in an environment where there are minors. COSTS:	The intern is responsible for all costs associated with the internship including

TRAVEL	Preparing travel arrangements to and from the internship host organization is the

ENTRY	Interns are responsible for informing themselves of what entry requirements are
REQUIREMENTS:	required to visit and work as an intern in the internship host country. These may include a visa, work permit, passport valid for at least 6 months after entry, and proof of certain vaccinations.
	The intern is responsible for acquiring all necessary documents in time for the beginning of their internship.

The Arts Internship Office will then transmit the selected applications to the host organization, which will ultimately be responsible for the selection of the candidate(s).
