



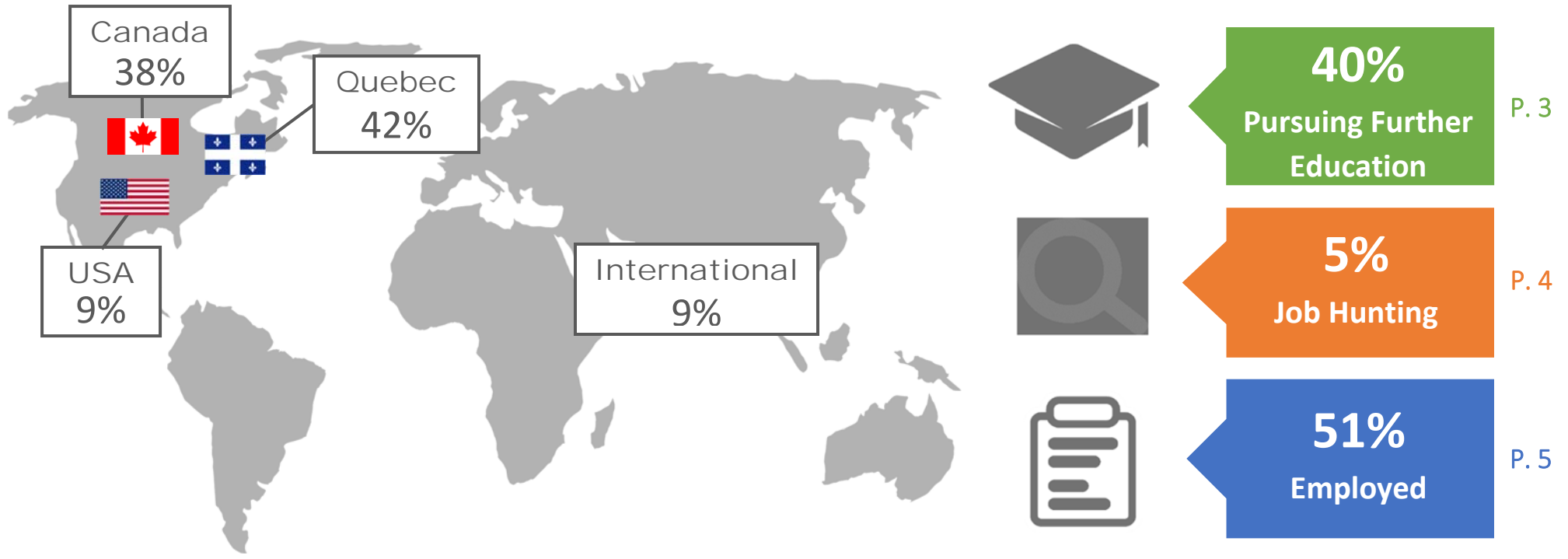
Destination Survey Results

Undergraduate Class of 2014

The purpose of the Destination Survey is to gain a better understanding of what recent McGill graduates are doing 12 to 18 months after graduation. In June 2016, 5100 undergraduate alumni from all faculties in the class of 2014 were invited to complete an online, bilingual and confidential survey.

A total of 423 graduates completed the survey between June and October 2016, with a total response rate of 8%. The majority of respondents were female (61%) and originated from Canada (80%).

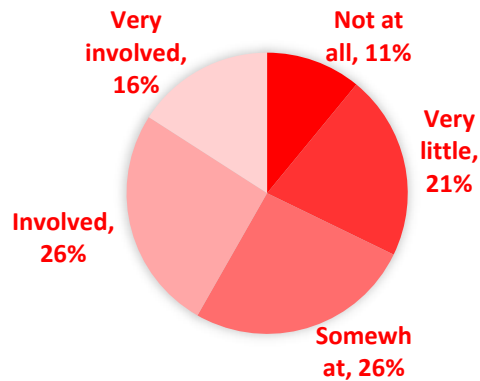

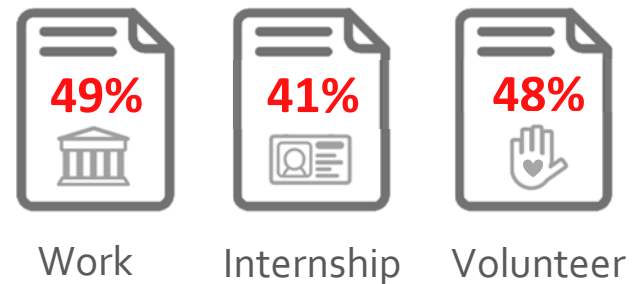

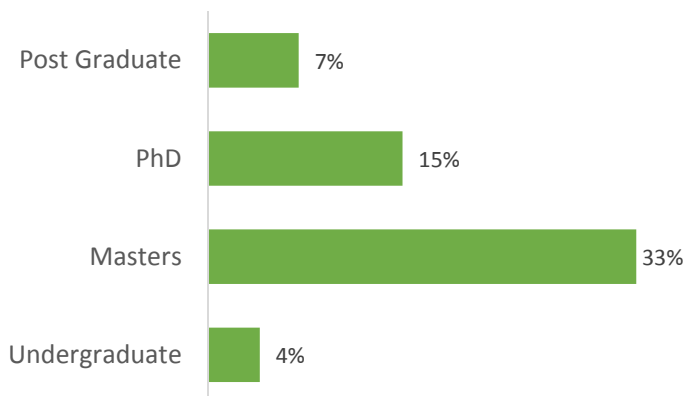

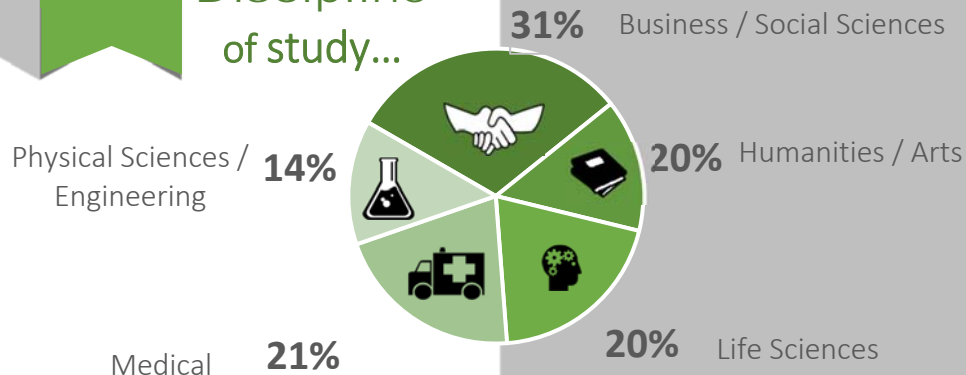

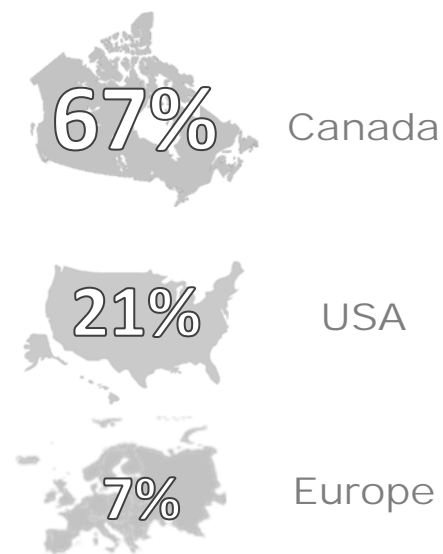
Discipline of study...



Reasons for further education...



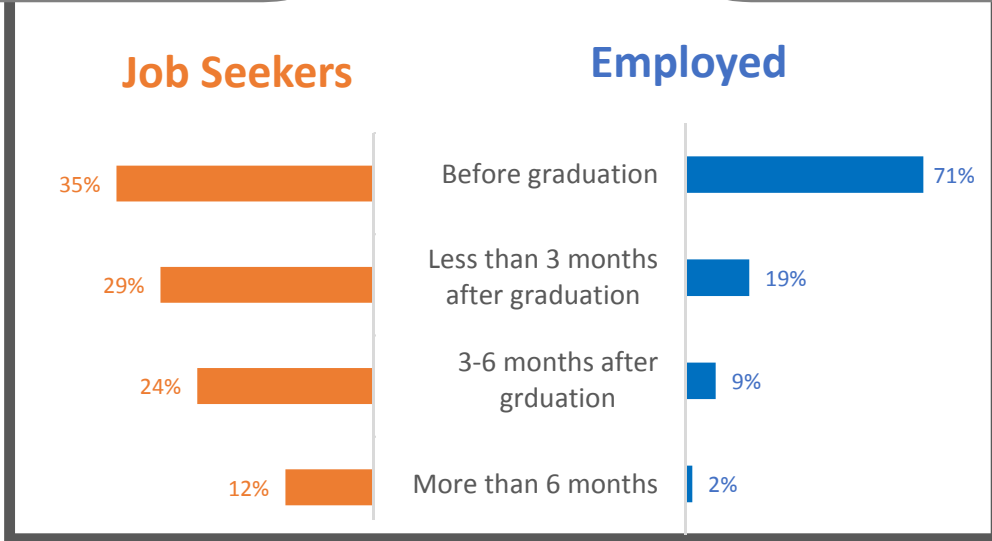
Location of further study...



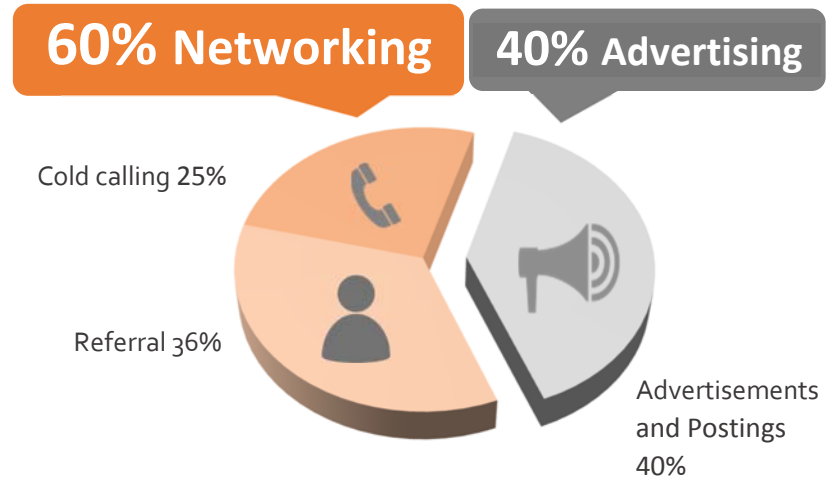

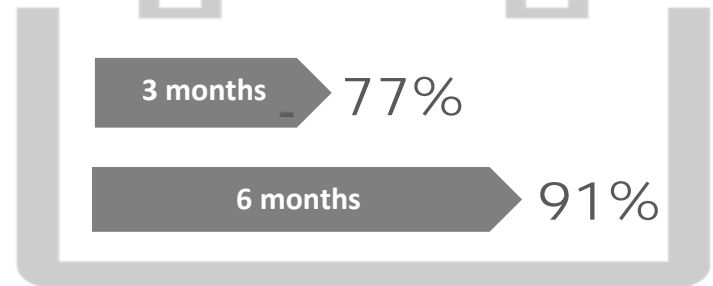

Within the following Timeline



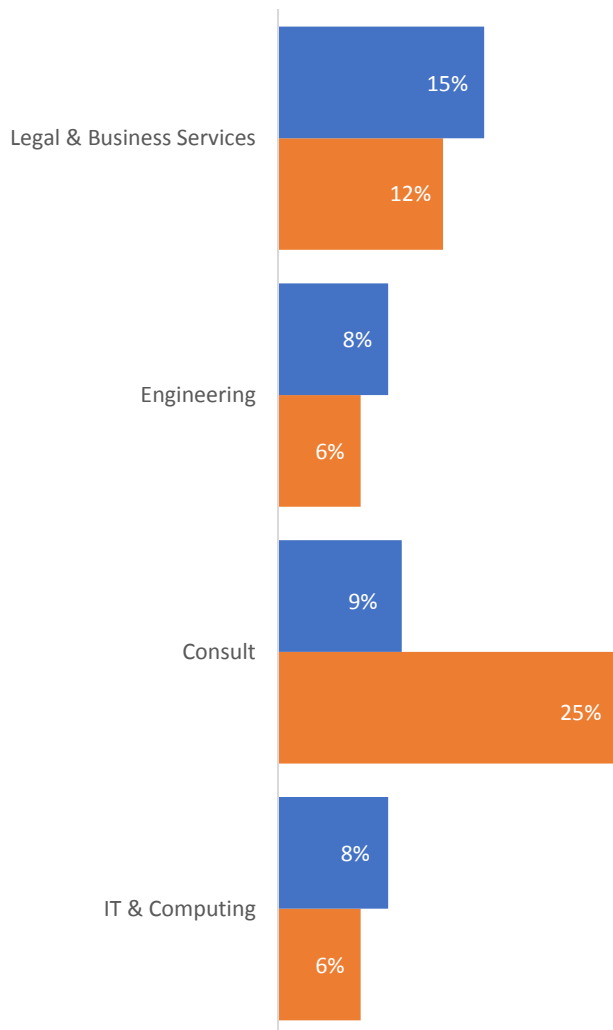

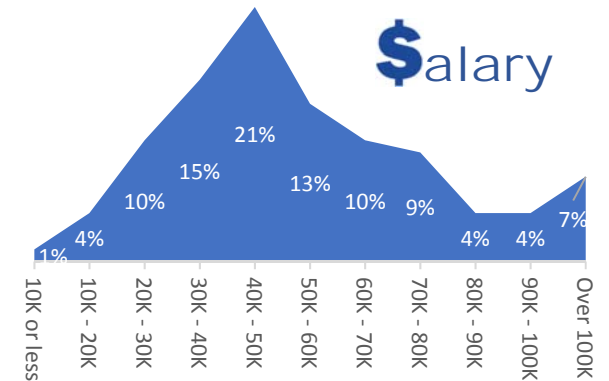

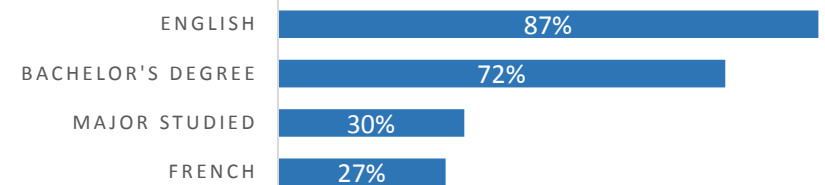
Job Position
