The Challenges of Integrating the Built Environment in the Context of Clinical Care: The CIRCUIT Experience Presented by Tracie Barnett, PhD

Tracie Barnett is an Associate Professor and FRQS Senior Career Award Scholar, She obtained her doctorate in Epidemiology at McGill University and completed a post-doctoral fellowship in Health Promotion in the department of Social and Preventive Medicine at Université de Montréal. The overarching aim of Dr. Barnett's program of research focuses on investigating the influence of features of built and social environments on cardiometabolic health, and how these can be leveraged to improve health outcomes and healthy behaviours. She is Executive director of the Health Services and Knowledge Translation Axis of the Quebec Cardiometabolic Diabetes and Obesity Network, and a founding and executive member of CIRCUIT, a lifestyle modification program for children and adolescents at risk of cardiovascular disease at Sainte-Justine.
