Screen time exposure to televisions, computers, electronic games and telephones has become a prominent feature of children's home environments. Three and four year-olds spend an estimated 4.5 hours per day watching television at home and in day care settings. Playing computer games on tablets has become a common early childhood pastime. In late elementary school, screen time exposure expands to include social media and networking, which have dramatically changed the nature and the effects of peer relationships on experience and development. Although there are positive aspects to this near constant contact with peers, there are also marked negative consequences, such as the farreaching damage from cyber-bullying.

Such widespread use and interactive capabilities of electronic media has also led to new opportunities for their use in health interventions. Successful e-tools for health promotion and management of acute and chronic mental health conditions are now increasingly used to support or treat children and adolescents. It is therefore timely that the overall theme for this year's conference is "Evidence-based Child Psychiatry in the Electronic Age."

We have an outstanding line-up of keynote speakers and presenters who will focus on electronic media at multiple levels, from how children's development is influenced from videogame and television exposure, to how to advise parents in the social media use of their children. They will discuss approaches to identifying, treating and monitoring psychopathology with computer and telephone based applications and the use of videoconferencing in education and clinical care. As always, the program also includes excellent submitted presentations on a wide variety of additional topics in child and adolescent psychiatry.
