Sun-Young Park is an architectural and urban historian specializing in modern France, currently Assistant Professor in George Mason University's Department of History and Art History. Her work lies at the intersection of cultural history, the history of the built environment, and the history of medicine. Her first

book, Ideals of the Body: Architecture, Urbanism, and Hygiene in Postrevolutionary Paris, is forthcoming with the University of Pittsburgh Press. Dr. Park received a B.A. in Architecture from Princeton University, and an M.Arch. and Ph.D. in the history of architecture and urbanism from Harvard University. Her research has been supported by the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Society of Architectural Historians, the Whiting Foundation, and the Minda de Gunzburg Center for European Studies at Harvard, among others. She is currently working on a second book project tentatively titled *The Architecture of Disability in Modern France*.
