Eric E. Roselli, MD, is Chief of Adult Cardiac Surgery, Director of the Aorta Center and a Staff Surgeon in the Cleveland Clinic Department of Thoracic and Cardiovascular Surgery and on the teaching faculty at the Cleveland Clinic Lerner College of Medicine. He is certified by the American Board of Surgery and the American Board of Thoracic Surgery.

He has authored or co-authored over 250 book chapters and articles in peer-reviewed journals on root, arch, and thoracoabdominal aortic aneurysms and dissection, endovascular surgery, reoperations, aortic valve disease, cardiac tumors, atrial fibrillation and transcatheter device development. Dr Roselli's research is focused on thoracic aortic dissection and aneurysms, and aortic valve and multi-valve disease. Specifically, his projects are directed at improving and developing safer and less invasive approaches to treat patients with these problems. He currently serves as the principal investigator and co-investigator for several device trials and holds several patents for novel devices to treat aortic disease. He is regularly presents his research at medical and surgical conferences worldwide.

Dr. Roselli is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and a member of the American College of Cardiology. He has served as a chairman and member of the program committee for multiple national meetings, co-authored practice guidelines for the treatment of patients with cardiovascular diseases, and is an active member of the American Association for Thoracic Surgery and the Society of Thoracic Surgeons.

**The Stikeman Endowment Fund for Surgical Advancement** was established following the untimely death of Richard Alan Stikeman in August 1965 of a malignant mesothelioma.


The Stikeman and McCall families set up the endowment under the guidance of Mr. Stikeman's surgeon, Dr. D.D. Munro, who was the Surgeon-in-Chief at the Royal Edward Chest Hospital (now the Montreal Chest Institute) affiliated with McGill University. The fund was mandated to be "people oriented", with the main objective to "sharpen people" who are engaged in the practice, training and research in Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery.

For fifty years, this fund has supported the Annual Stikeman Visiting Professorship, in which world leaders in Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery were invited to visit McGill, gave lectures and participated in discussions. Over the years, it evolved into an occasion for the reunion of previous residents in Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery at McGill University, providing a forum for professional, scientific and personal interactions among the alumni, current staff and trainees.

Thus, the **Stikeman Visiting Professorship** has become an outstanding occasion both for scholarship and friendship, contributing significantly to the development and vitality of Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery at McGill University. This professorship has been referred to as the "glue" which holds the McGill Division together.
