If you are an undergraduate student (BSc level or Cégep) who's been working at the Douglas, then you are invited to submit an abstract for a poster presentation at this exciting event! Your submission should include your name and level of studies, the name of your supervisor, and an abstract with a title, list of authors, and a description of your project (max. 200 words). The content of the abstract and poster should be mainly research contributions by you, the undergraduate student. The maximum size of your poster must be 3.9 feet high x 2.9 feet wide. Abstract submitters will be notified in early August about whether they are invited to present a poster. There will be prizes for best posters!

This is a great chance to present your work and learn about the research of your peers, don't miss out!
