### **DR. SCOTT STEELE**

Dr. Scott Steele, Chairman of the Department of Colorectal Surgery and Rupert B Turnbull MD Endowed Chair in Colorectal Surgery at the Cleveland Clinic, Ohio, received his medical degree from the University of Wisconsin Medical School. He completed his surgical residency at Madigan Army Medical Centre in Tacoma, Washington & his fellowship in Colorectal Surgery at the University of Minnesota.

After having been on staff at the Madigan army Medical Center, he served as Chief of Colorectal Surgery for 9 years. Subsequently, he served as Vice-Chairman for Clinical Affairs and Division Chief of Colon & Rectal Surgery and Associate Director of Surgical Services at University Hospitals Cleveland Ohio. He is currently Professor of Surgery at Cleveland Clinic Lerner College of Medicine at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland. He is on the editorial boards of numerous peer-reviewed journals and has been the recipient of the Victor Fazio Award for Editorial Excellence from the American Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons on behalf of Diseases of the Colon and Rectum. His merits as an outstanding educator have been rewarded In his Army career, having received The LTC Joseph A Munaretto Outstanding Staff Educator Award at Madigan Army Medical Center as well as the Surgeon General's Physician Recognition Award, awarded to the most outstanding LTC Physician in the entire US Army Medical Department. He has served on the executive of many national & regional surgical societies and has co-authored numerous peer-reviewed publications. We are thrilled to welcome Dr. Steele to McGill and the Jewish General Hospital as the 2019 Philip H. Gordon Visiting Professor in Colorectal Surgery.

#### PHILIP H. GORDON, MD, FRCSC, FACS Professor of Surgery and Oncology McGill University

Dr. Gordon graduated from the University of Saskatchewan Faculty of Medicine in 1966. He trained in General Surgery at the Jewish General Hospital and became the first fellow in Colorectal Surgery at the University of Minnesota under Dr. Stanley Goldberg in 1973. He became an honorary assistant in surgery at St Mark's Hospital in London in 1974 where he co-authored the landmark paper on

anal fistulas with the Late Sir Allan Parks. He subsequently returned to the Jewish General Hospital where he began his career in Colorectal Surgery.

Dr. Gordon was instrumental in beginning colorectal surgery at McGill and in Canada. He was the founding President of the Canadian Society of Colorectal Surgeons from 1982-1986. He was the only Canadian to have served as President of the American Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons in 1994. He co-authored several textbooks on Colorectal Surgery, which have served as references in the field. He has served on numerous editorial boards of prestigious peer-reviewed journals, and has co-authored numerous articles in peer-reviewed journals and textbooks. He has become an honorary member of the Royal Society of Medicine Section of Coloproctology as well as of the Association of Coloproctology of Great Britain and Ireland. He was named to the Faculty Honour List for Educational Excellence in recognition of contributions to teaching in the McGill Faculty of Medicine in 2007.

This lecture was established to recognize Dr. Gordon's life-long devotion and contributions to Colorectal Surgery at the Jewish General Hospital, McGill University and the community at large.
