

For the fiscal year 2019-2020, McGill SCS received **937 gifts** from **642 donors** living in **55 different cities** worldwide. In one year, we collected a total of **\$214,973.25**.




Your Participation Made a Difference!

SCS Giving in Numbers






The celebration does not only exhibit the success of the School, but it also demonstrates the strength and solidarity of the SCS Community.

These are the fundraising priorities for the fiscal year 2021:



Remote Learning Technologies: To ensure that instructors have the tools to deliver the best learning experience they can through technologies



Indigenous Initiatives: To support the 360 program and other initiatives that respond to the specific needs of Indigenous adult learners.



McGill Community for Lifelong Learning: To increase accessibility for current and new members, as most of the members are highly impacted by the pandemic



Career Advising & Transition Services: In time of economic resurgence, CATS services are in demand to help career-seekers match with an opportunity



Bursary and Scholarship Funds: this fund will help SCS students with unforeseen expenses they are facing right now.
