Job Summary

The parent coach is a key member of the See Things My Way clinical team. The parent coach will be responsible, on a full-time basis, for providing parent coach services, using the PESDM program (Early Start Denver Model[™] parent coaching) to families of preschool autistic children.

Responsibilities

- Undergo training for PESDM
- Utilizing best practices, provide one-on-one weekly PESDM parent coaching, with supervision, for 13-week blocks, to parents whose children have been diagnosed with ASD.
 - Obtain consent, do initial assessments and develop customized program objectives;
 - Prepare materials and physical space for coaching sessions;
 - Provide coaching sessions and monitor progress;
 - Provide final assessment and feedback report, in person and in writing.
- Coordinate follow-up with pre-existing health (e.g. STMW Assessment Centre) and social care providers as required.
- Collect and record all required data for each family on an ongoing basis for each using a custom software (including previous evaluation reports).
- Participate, as needed, in research and program evaluation initiatives.
- Participate, as needed, in program optimization initiatives to continually improve the program.
- Participate, as needed, in clinical meetings.
- Provided reporting as needed to the See Things My Way Centre for Innovation.

Knowledge and abilities

- Demonstrated strong commitment to contributing to the care and support of children with developmental disabilities and their families and to working professionally and respectfully with internal and external partners
- Demonstrated ability to effectively interpret and communicate assessment results, evaluations, and proposed treatment in a manner easily understood by parents and other caregivers in the natural environment.
- Demonstrated knowledge of child development theories and cognitive behavioural theories, for neurotypical and autistic children.
- Demonstrated knowledge of families' quality of life and experiences when living with children with ASD (stress, challenges, difficulties and distress) and knowledge on how to intervene when such difficulties arise.
- Has a client- and family-centred approach to care, is quality-driven and is open to innovation to best meet the needs of the client.
- Has demonstrated research skills and is open to research collaboration to inform practice as required.
- Excellent communication skills overall, both verbal and written
- Enjoys teaching and supervision.
- Must have scheduling flexibility in order to meet the needs of families.
- Excellent interpersonal skills, particularly with families from a wide-range of socio- economic and ethno-cultural backgrounds

- Completely at ease with technology (Microsoft office applications and learning new specialty software)
- Works effectively and professionally in a team environment
- Is completely bilingual (verbal and written)

Education and Experience

- Minimum two (2) years experience working with children and/or parents of children who present with developmental delays, and especially in the areas of autism spectrum disorders (ASD) and intellectual disability (assessment, coaching and direct intervention).
- Educational Background could include psychology, psycho-education, speech language pathology, occupational therapy, social work, or specialized early education.
- Experience with Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT) and/or the Hanen programs would be helpful.
