## **BCom Registration**

Course Load

- Register in courses in both Fall AND Winter terms in June.
- Add 12-15 credits in each term to be a full-time student.
- 15 credits is the maximum credits permitted per term.

**IMPORTANT REMINDERS!** 

- Do not wait until the start of term to add courses.
- Remember your schedule may change if your preferred courses or sections are full on your registration date. Have an alternative ready

Add- drop deadlines

- Fall 2025 Tuesday, September 9
- Winter 2026 Tuesday, January 20

Add/drop means you can adjust your schedule for each term until the dates mentions above.

## Determine what you should take in your first year depending on your admit type.

Consult the <u>BCom newly admitted webpage</u> to see the course requirements and course options for registration in your first year.

- 1. Admissions must receive your final, official results.
- 2. They will evaluate and process transfer credits throughout the summer and fall term.
- 3. You should check your unofficial Minerva transcript regularly for updated credits and course exemptions!
- 4. Adjust your course registration if needed when your credits are transferred.
- 5. Ask a BCom Academic Advisor for help.

### BCom Math Course Exemptions CEGEP STUDENTS

**CEGEP DEC** 

Exempt from BCOM MATH courses, given a permit by Admissions to add MGCR 271 in U1

FB in Quebec

with attestation exempt from Math in BCom degree, without the attestation see a BCom academic advisor.

Depending on the level of MATH courses you took in your DEC you may need to take additional courses in Math at McGill **if you plan to study a program in Mathematics**. Students who have a DEC in Commerce or Social Sciences should consult the Math Departmental Advisor if they plan to pursue a Mathematics and Statistics Major or Minor.

**Course overlap:** Any student who receives exemption from MATH 122 or MATH 140, MATH 141, or MATH 123 or MATH 133 cannot take those courses at McGill for credit.

**MATH Placement tests** are available in August to receive exemptions from our required Math course (s).

## BCom Math Course Exemptions and Credits UO and Advanced Standing

U0

MUST TAKE MATH 122 or MATH 140 and MATH 123 or MATH 133

French Baccalaureate

with Math specialization- receive credit for Calculus, must take Algebra without Math speciality - must take both Calculus and Algebra

International Baccalaureate

with HL Math, grade of 5, receive credit for Calculus, must take Algebra with SL Math- must take both Calculus and Algebra

A Level Math

most receive credit for Calculus, must take Algebra

AP Math

Calc AB – receive MATH 140, Calc BC – receive MATH 140, 141, must take Algebra

#### **Course overlap:**

Any student who receives exemption from MATH 122 or MATH 140, MATH 141, or MATH 123 or MATH 133 cannot take those courses at McGill for credit.

**MATH Placement tests** are available in August to receive exemptions from our required Math course(s).

Instead of taking MATH 122 or MATH 123, students should take MATH 140, MATH 141 & 133

- Major in Mathematics and Statistics for Management
- Minor or Minor Concentration in Mathematics or Statistics
- Minor in Computer Science

\* Minor Concentration in Computer Science MATH 140, 141, or 133 are optional if students wish to take these courses in place of MATH 122 and MATH 123.

Please consult the departments for advising.

Students from CEGEP Social Science or Commerce DECs, should check that they have the appropriate Math background by meeting with the Math Department academic advisor.

Students who begin with MATH 122 and-or MATH 123 and decide to pursue one of these programs, keep credits for the courses.



### **Important Note:**

## Students usually begin their program courses in U2, however, these majors take planning in U1.

#### Honours Investment Management

Students must have completed, or be in the process of completing, the following courses:

- MGCR 211
- MGCR 271
- MGCR 341
- Application deadline: January
- Students apply in U1.

#### **Major in Economics**

Major in Economics, students replace selected CORE courses with Economics Major courses:

#### **International Management Major**

#### This major has three components:

- International Business
   Concentration (15 credits)
- Minor Concentration (18 credits)
- Language Component- 6-12 credits or Intermediate level of a language

For the Minor concentration and language courses, students can take these courses in U0 or U1.



#### **CORE Courses in U0**



#### **U0** Required Core Courses:

- MGCR 250 Expressive Analysis for Management
- MGCR 233 Intro to Data Programming

#### **U0 Optional Core Courses:**

Students may pick a maximum of 2 courses from this list:

- MGCR 222 Organizational Behavior (optional U0 course)
- MGCR 352 Marketing (optional U0 course)
- MGCR 211 Financial Accounting (optional U0 course)

Register in Electives to complete your schedule.

**Advisor Hint:** To help you adjust to university studies, we suggest you divide your core courses between Fall and Winter terms. Or you can focus on electives in U0 and take the optional core courses in U1 instead.

- •MGCR 331 Information Technology Management (3 credits)
- •MGCR 341 Introduction to Finance (3 credits) TAKEN WITH MGCR 271 or after
- MGCR 352 Principles of Marketing (3 credits)
- •MGCR 372 Operations Management. (3 credits) PREREQUISITE MGCR 271
- MGCR 382 International Business (3 credits)

Students may also take electives outside Management in U1.

## AP Examination Credits: What to Expect

For each AP exam with a grade of 4 or higher, 3 credits will be granted toward your McGill degree.

These credits can be granted in two ways:

McGill course exemption for example,

Calc AB = MATH 140, 3 credits

Or Generic Credits exemption for example,

Microeconomics= ECON 1xx, 3 credits

#### **Course overlap:**

You cannot receive credit for the same course or its equivalent twice. If you repeat a course, it will be excluded from both credits and GPA.

## 3-21 credits of AP credits = enter in U0 24 credits or more of AP credits = enter in U1

- If you are changed from U0 to U1 after your AP credits are processed between July August, you will have to register in June as a U0 student.
- You can change your schedule once you are officially changed to U1 later in the summer and before classes start.
- Students with 3-21 credits of AP in U0 may ask an advisor for help in adding selected, additional core courses to a maximum credit number in their first year at the start of term if space remains.



## Advanced Level Examinations: What to expect

 Students will usually receive 30 credits when 3 HL subjects are completed with the required grades.

- Make sure to order the results for each subject from all boards and in all years in which you wrote exams.
- The full 30 credits may not be processed on your Minerva unofficial transcript until ALL of your exam results from all subjects have been received and reviewed by the Admissions office.

Credits are usually only processed in September because of the timing of the release of your final results.

It is important to see a Bcom Academic Advisor during registration in June or at the start of classes at the latest to review your course registration.

**REMINDER:** You will register in U1 and should take MATH 123 in the fall term. You will not be able to add MGCR 271 until admissions transfers credit for calculus.

## French Baccalaureate: What to Expect

Students will enter the program in U1

**Students with** Math specialization- receive credit for Calculus, must take Algebra and receive 30 credits

**Students without** Math speciality - must take both Calculus and Algebra and receive 27 credits.

In June when you register your official transfer credits may not have been added to your record.

This means you cannot register in MGCR 271 in the winter term since the Calculus exemption will be not added to your transcript.

If you completed **the MATH specialization** and register in MATH 123 in the fall term, email <a href="mailto:bcom.mgmt@mcgill.ca">bcom.mgmt@mcgill.ca</a> to request a permit to register in MGCR 271 in June.

## International Baccalaureate: What to Expect

#### **International Baccalaureate Diploma:**

3 HL courses with a Grade of 5 or higher with HL MATH = 30 credits including MATH 122 (MATH 140)

3 HL courses with a grade of 5 or higher and SL MATH – 27 credits WITHOUT MATH 122 (MATH 140)

 Students who receive a grade below 5 in one or more HL courses, receive fewer Advanced
 Standing credits and would start in U0. Consult a Bcom Academic Advisor for assistance!

For HL International Baccalaureate courses with a grade of 5 or higher, (without the full diploma) students are granted the credit of the subject – usually 6 credits for a social science/humanities, and science can be 3, 6, or 8 credits.

For ENGL 1XX and HIST 1XX for example it would be 6 credits.

In these cases, please email <a href="mailto:bcom.mgmt@mcgill.ca">bcom.mgmt@mcgill.ca</a> to inform our office. We will not see your results automatically. You must let us know!!

## Pre-McGill University or College Courses: What to Expect

If you completed university or college courses prior to McGill, you must submit an official transcript to McGill Admissions.

You may receive credit toward your McGill degree if the course is deemed equivalent from a recognized university or college after evaluation. Consult an advisor for the steps to process credit requests.

## Finalizing Your Offer of Admission

Your final, official results must be sent to the Admissions Office <u>directly</u> from your school or examining board.

This step is required to finalize your admission file and for you to receive credits for any of your pre-McGill studies.

Send us your final marks Deadline: September 30, 2025

**Advising hint:** You will find your final advanced standing credit on your unofficial Minerva transcript only after Admissions has received your final results and processed any credits.

Before this stage, you can seek advising from a BCom Academic Advisor if you are unsure of what credits or exemptions you will receive.
