Samer Faraj holds the Canada Research Chair in Technology, Innovation & Organizing at the Desautels Faculty of Management, McGill University. He is head of the research group on Complex Collaboration and is the Director of the Faculty's PhD program. His current research focuses on complex collaboration in settings as diverse as healthcare organizations, knowledge teams, and online communities. He is also interested in how emergent social technologies are transforming organizations and allowing new forms of coordination and organizing to emerge.

He has published over 130 journal articles, refereed proceedings, and book chapters in outlets such as: Academy of Management Journal, Academy of Management Review, Management Science, Organization Science, MIS Quarterly, Information Systems Research, Journal of AIS, Journal of Applied Psychology, and Annals of Emergency Medicine.
