# Comparing Startup Ecosystems

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> Information Session August 7-26, 2022

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### About the Program

- Introduction to startup ecosystems via a comparison of the Canadian/North American and Israeli startup ecosystems.
  - ▶ Why Israel?
- Collaborative and experiential ~3-week study trip between the Desautels Faculty of Management and an Israeli partner university.
  - ▶ 18 Desautels students. 6 students from an Israeli university.
  - Roughly 1 week in Canada and 2 weeks in Israel.
  - Collaborate with Israeli students throughout the program.
  - Experience course concepts in action with partnering startups, investors, and other key agencies and organizations.
- Trip is sponsored in part by an external foundation.
  - Consequently, the program is heavily-subsidized.
  - Many expenses convered (e.g., round-trip air travel to Israel, company visits, tours, and some meals).







### The Opportunity

- 3-week program for 6 credit hours.
  - Credit for FINE434 (Topics in Finance).
  - Credit for ORGB434 (Topics in Organizational Behaviour).
  - Why Finance? Why Organizational Behaviour?
- Subsidized trip fee: \$1,750.
  - Fee does not include: (i) Tuition costs for 2 courses, (ii) costs to obtain proper documentation to travel to Israel & remain in Canada (e.g., passport, visa, etc.), (iii) costs for sightseeing/entertainment/etc not included in itinerary, and (iv) some meals/snacks (e.g., most lunch and dinners).
- Unique learning opportunity.
  - Experiential.
  - Collaborative.
  - Opportunity to network.
  - Atypical course deliverables.
  - Cultural travel experience included.
  - Promising early career results from first cohort of program.





#### The Courses

- 3-week program for 6 credit hours.
  - Credit for FINE434 (Topics in Finance) and ORGB434 (Topics in Org Behaviour).
  - In addition to comparing startup ecosystems, we focus on a deep dive theme.
  - This year's theme: Impact Investing in the Startup Ecosystem.
- Teaching: 2 credits but 2 courses are integrated.
  - Some ``traditional lectures''.
  - Some site visits to startups, VCs, and other organizations.
  - Some groupwork and group brainstorming.
  - Some historical and cultural site visits.

#### ■ Deliverables:

- Play a role in organization and logistics of the trip.
- ► Reflection journal.
- Foroup project on startup ecosystems (including a presentation at end of trip).
- No formal exams.





### Timeline and Application Process

- February 25: Applications Due.
  - Link: http://www.mcgill.ca/desautels/israel-study-trip/application
  - Followed by (potentially selective) interviewing.
  - Acceptance offer on rolling basis (from us).
  - Acceptance agreement (written from student).
- March 31: Enrollment Finalized.
  - ► Shortly Thereafter: Non-Refundable Enrollment Fee Due.
- August 7 (Roughly): Montreal Portion.
  - Israeli students arrive in Montreal.
  - Roughly 1 week of content and cultural and professional site visits.
  - Also plan to visit Quebec City and Charlevoix.
- August 15 (Roughly): Israel Portion.
  - All students arrive in Israel.
  - Roughly 2 weeks of content and cultural and professional site visits & tours.
  - Plan to visit: Tel Aviv, Jerusalem, Haifa, Dead Sea, Masada, Beer Sheva, etc.
- August 26 (Roughly): Return to Montreal













### Eligibility

- Must be a student at the Desautels Faculty of Management.
- Must still be a student during the Fall semester of 2022.
- Must have a valid passport.
- Must be at least 18 years of age.
- Must not have visited Israel before.
