NEW CASPer Test Score Admissions Requirement

Do I need to take the CASPer test?

All applicants to the following Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) Programs, in the Department of Integrated Studies in Education (DISE), Faculty of Education, McGill University are required to complete an online assessment, [CASPer®](#), to be eligible for admission:

- B.Ed. in Kindergarten and Elementary Education (except the First Nations and Inuit Education (FNIE) option)
- B.Ed. in Secondary Education (all profiles)
- B.Ed. in Teaching English as a Second Language (all options)
- B.Ed. in Music (except applicants to the Concurrent B.Mus/B.Ed. program)

What is CASPer?

[CASPer®](#) is an online test that assesses personal and professional characteristics that we believe are important for successful students and graduates of our program.

What do I need to do to prepare to take the test?

In order to take CASPer, you will be responsible for securing access to a laptop or desktop computer. You will require the following for both account creation and taking the test:

- Government-issued photo ID
- Valid email address
- Working webcam
- Working microphone
- Reliable high-speed internet connection

How do I register for the test?

Please go to www.takeCASPer.com to create your CASPer account. You must select **Bachelor of Education – McGill University**, and sign up for the **CSP-10209 – Canadian Teacher's Education 1** test. You can take the test in English or French, and you will be provided with a limited number of testing [dates and times](#) based on the admissions timeline and requirements.

Please also note that the '[Snapshot](#)' portion (an extension of the CASPer Test) is NOT required for applicants to our B.Ed. programs for this admissions cycle, however, because of its one-time completion, other programs you are applying to may require it.

What if I need accommodations?

If you require testing accommodations for CASPer, you will need to submit the [Accommodations Request Form](#) signed by you and your qualified professional 3 weeks in advance of your test date. More information regarding CASPer accommodations can be found [here](#).
