

OUTSTANDING TEACHING **GRADUATE AWARD**

Call for Applications

Description

The Department of Integrated Studies in Education recognizes and values the importance of university teaching as part of a graduate students' academic dossier. The Department of Integrated Studies in Education (DISE) Graduate Student Teaching Award is given to recognize an exceptional graduate student who has demonstrated teaching excellence at the undergraduate and/or graduate level in DISE and/or McGill. The award is intended to foster a culture of teaching excellence among graduate students. Examples of teaching excellence can include but are not limited to:

- creation or use of new and innovative teaching methods and course materials
- effectiveness in feedback, review sessions or one-on-one instruction
- creating a learning environment that is collaborative and inclusive and challenges students to move beyond the status quo

Amount of award

Minimum value for MA student: \$500; minimum value for PhD student: \$1,000

Eligibility

All <u>full-time</u> PhD students and MA-thesis students in DISE, regardless of citizenship.



- Students cannot be at or exceed the departmental funding cap, as stipulated in the DISE Funding Guidelines.
- PhD students must have submitted their progress tracking reports at the time of the award submission deadline.
- Students cannot be in a "thesis evaluation" term.
- Preference will be given to students who have not previously received this award. •
- Incomplete applications, late applications or applications that do not adhere to the requirements (e.g., page limits) will not be considered.

Requirements

Application packages must include the following items (All items should be single-spaced, 12point Times New Roman font, 1-inch margins):

- 1. a summary of the applicant's: a) teaching assignments (both TA-ships and instructor positions) in DISE or McGill (including course number, course name and year); b) the applicant's approach to teaching, including methods of feedback/assessment; and c) evidence of the impact of their teaching in the classroom (max. 2 pages). Examples of approaches and impacts may include:
 - creation or use of new and innovative teaching methods and course materials
 - effectiveness in feedback, review sessions or one-on-one instruction
 - creation of challenging and innovative courses
- 2. two letters of recommendation from former students (max. 1 page per letter). Letters should speak to both the importance and impact of the applicant's teaching, with a clear rationale as to why we should select the applicant.
 - Letters from current students will not be accepted.
- 3. a list of the applicant's evidence of reflective practice (max. 1 page). This may include:
 - Presentations about teaching
 - Publications about teaching
 - Other outputs (websites, artistic, etc.) targeted to a practitioner audience
- 4. additional supporting materials should include:
 - A summary of scores for questions 1-6 from the course evaluations
 - A set of intact student comments
