#### **Important Dates:**

Fall 2023 and Winter 2024 registration will open for returning students on:

Wednesday, May 29 – Registration opens for undergraduate students entering U3/U4

Thursday, May 30 – Registration opens for undergraduate students entering U2

Friday, May 31 – Registration opens for undergraduate students entering U1/all other

### **Registration Requirements**

- It is crucial that students register for both the Fall 2024 and Winter 2025 terms.
- Registration will take place via Minerva following a "time ticketing" system. As such, it is each student's responsibility to inform themselves of their registration date/time.
- It is the responsibility of the student to verify the registration dates and add/drop course deadlines on Minerva.
  - A late fee will be applied if registration dates are not respected.

#### Withdrawal

### **Graduation Requirements**

Students should take note of the following requirements for graduation. It is the student's responsibility to complete all required tasks prior to the respective deadlines.

### Standard First Aid and Level C CPR

All students in the B.Sc. Kinesiology (Major) program are required, by January 15<sup>th</sup> for Fall term graduates or April 15<sup>th</sup> for Winter term graduates, to show proof of certification in Standard/Emergency First Aid AND Level C in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), including Anaphylaxis. Equivalencies may be considered. Certificates must be submitted for verification to the KPE Student Affairs Coordinator via studentaffairs.kpe@mcgill.ca.

### **Application for Graduation**

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#### SPECIAL NOTE REGARDING COMPLEMENTARY CREDITS

As per your **ADMIT YEAR** *Program Profile* (downloadable from the KPE Advising webpage, "Current Students" tab) students must complete a <u>minimum of 15</u> <u>Complementary credits</u> to be fulfilled by completing the minimum number of credits from the following disciplines:

Stats (3cr) choose ONLY one from: EDPE 375, MATH 203 or PSYC 204

*Psychosocial* (<u>3cr</u>) choose <u>at least one</u> from: EDKP 394 *Historical Perspectives* EDKP 405 *Sport in Society* EDKP 548 *Applied Exercise Psychology* (restricted to U3 students due to EDKP 448 *Exercise and Health Psychology* pre-requisite)

*Biomechanics/Motor Learning* (<u>3cr</u>) choose <u>at least one</u> from: EDKP 444 *Ergonomics* EDKP 446 *Physical Activity and Ageing* EDKP 566 *Advanced Biomechanics Theory* 

*Exercise Physiology* (<u>6cr</u>) choose <u>at least two</u> from: EDKP 445 *Exercise Metabolism* EDKP 449 *Neuromuscular and Inflammatory Pathophysiology* EDKP 485 *Cardiopulmonary Exercise Pathophysiology* EDKP 495 *Scientific Principles of Training* 

This does not mean that you cannot take more EDKP courses. Should you choose to take more than the minimum 15crs required of the *Complementary* category, and go over 24cr of EDKP-specific courses, they will count towards the *Elective* credits of the program.

#### **MINOR PROGRAMS**

For those of you considering pursuing a Minor Program, some have an application process with a specified application period ie: Minor Entrepreneurship for Kinesiology Students. For complete details visit: <u>https://www.mcgill.ca/isa/student/minor</u>

Some Minor programs require you to, simply, declare them in Minerva in the *Student Menu* > *Student Records Menu* > *Change Primary Curriculum Menu*, ie: Minor Psychology.

Elective credits are fulfilled with the courses required for the Minor program you enroll in, up to a maximum of 24crs.

It is recommended that Minor programs are started in U2 (Year 2).
