INSTRUCTIONAL METHOD

Two class sessions will be held per week. Each session will contain practical and theoretical material. Classes will run on Mondays and Fridays in gyms ½.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This two-credit skills course is offered exclusively to students studying within the physical education program at McGill University. Students will learn how to perform the basic skills/techniques involved in the sport of basketball and will be able to understand the key mechanics involved in each of these different skills/techniques. Students will also learn the rules and regulations of basketball and will be able to implement this knowledge into game situations. Students will also learn how to design sport-specific games and activities in order to meet the needs of both elementary and high school aged students. This course aims to instruct students on how to become better basketball teachers/coaches while also helping to develop fundamental basketball skills.

EVALUATION

- 10 % Basketball Rules Quiz. This written examination will cover the rules of basketball. (January 21st). Study Guide will be posted on myCourses. The quiz will be held in room 152
- 30 % Basketball YouTube Assignment. Details of this assignment will be posted on myCourses. (March 18th).
- 30 % Team Teaching. In groups of two or potentially solo, students will teach a 30-minute basketball lesson and provide a lesson plan highlighting the activities presented. Partners and topics will be assigned.
- 10 % Theoretical Final. This exam will cover all the theoretical information presented in the course. (April 12th). The final will be held in room 305.
- 15 % Practical Final. This evaluation is based on the student's ability to demonstrate technically sound basketball skills. Practical evaluation is not based on skill improvement. (April 1st and 5th)
- **5%** *Leadership and Professionalism.* Students will be graded on their leadership capabilities, professionalism, and engagement in the class.
