

Awards for Equity, Diversity and Inclusivity Nomination Guidelines

Purpose: The Engineering Inclusivity, Diversity and Equity Advancement (E-IDEA) initiative of the Faculty of Engineering seeks to recognize students for outstanding individual or group initiatives that promote and foster an inclusive work, learning or living environment on campus

Description of Awards:

The **Preston Phipps Equity and Diversity Award** is presented once per year to an undergraduate or graduate student or student group that has actively engaged in building a diverse, equitable, and inclusive community in the Faculty of Engineering. Recipients will receive a plaque and monetary award from an endowment generously contributed by Preston Phipps.

The WSP Equity and Diversity Award will be used to support the E-IDEA initiative and will recognize the contribution and commitment of an undergraduate or graduate student or student group who works towards building a diverse, equitable, and inclusive community in the Faculty of Engineering. Recipients will be selected on an annual basis and receive a plaque and monetary award.

Eligibility Requirements:

Nominated individuals must:

• Be registered as a full-time student in the term in which they are nominated. **Only students registered in the Faculty of Engineering will be considered.**

For student groups, they must:

- Be recognized by EUS, PGSS or SSMU as an official McGill-affiliated group
- At least 75% of group members must be students registered in the Faculty of Engineering

Criteria: A student or student group must have a commitment and demonstrated leadership in the area of equity, diversity, and inclusion. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Building a pipeline and recruiting underrepresented populations into the Faculty of Engineering
- Work on supporting and retaining underrepresented populations in their academic program
- Increasing the diversity of the workforce
- Involvement in student organizations
- Participation on committees (student committees and university committees)
- Organization of special events, conferences, etc.
- Involvement in advocacy groups
- Involvement in volunteer organizations, within the campus setting and/or in the general community.

Also, for these awards, commitment is defined as demonstrating values of diversity, equity and inclusion in learning, outreach, and/or community engagement. Examples include:

- A student who works towards creating an environment where all people feel welcome through their studies, extracurricular activities or personal life.
- An ongoing event or series of events that helps students from an under-represented group feel welcome and included
- A tool or practice that increases accessibility for people who experience barriers, e.g., mental, learning, physical, social, cultural, etc.
- Adapting or changing procedures, policies or practices to make them fair or more inclusive

Nomination Procedure: Any student, faculty member or staff person registered in or working in the Faculty of Engineering may submit a nomination. Nominations should include:

For individuals:

- Completed nomination form
- Two (2) letters of support
- CV

For groups:

- Completed nomination form
- Two (2) letters of support

<u>Deadline</u>: Nominations for the 2020 Summer & Fall semesters must be emailed to Rosie Russo-Pinzarrone at <u>rosaria.russo@mcgill.ca</u>, by Friday, February 26th, 2021, by 4:00 p.m.

Adjudication:

A Sub-Committee of the Engineering Committee on Faculty Awards will review and evaluate nominations and then make recommendations to the main committee. This sub-committee will be composed of:

- Associate Dean, Faculty Affairs (Chair of Sub-Committee)
- 1 student representative
- 1 representative of the McGill Engineering Student Centre (MESC)
- 2 Faculty Equity Ambassadors

The Engineering Committee on Faculty Awards, chaired by the Dean or his/her representative, makes the final decision as to whether or not to give an award and to whom it is to be given. If a member of the Sub-Committee is nominated for an award, they will be recused from the process and a replacement member will be nominated by the Dean, if necessary.
