

Professor Martin Levine Scholarship

Established In Honour of Professor Emeritus Martin Levine

Established in 2020 by Mr. David Mei-Tzou Ting (BEng'73, MEng'79), in Honour of his former professor, Dr. Martin Levine (BEng'60, MEng'63), for one or more undergraduate students who have completed at least one year of undergraduate studies in the Faculty of Engineering.



Dr. Martin Levine received his BEng and MEng degrees in Electrical and Computer Engineering from McGill University in 1960 and 1963, respectively, and his PhD degree in Electrical Engineering from the Imperial College of Science and Technology, University of London, England, in 1965.

He was the first academic in Canada to teach courses on computer vision and artificial intelligence. He later consulted various government agencies and industrial organizations, including working on the vision system for the Mars Rover. Now an Emeritus Professor, Martin Levine continues to have a profound influence on the fields of computer vision, image processing and artificial intelligence.

His life's work continues through the impact he has had on his students and the founding of the Centre for Intelligent Machines (CIM) here at McGill University.
