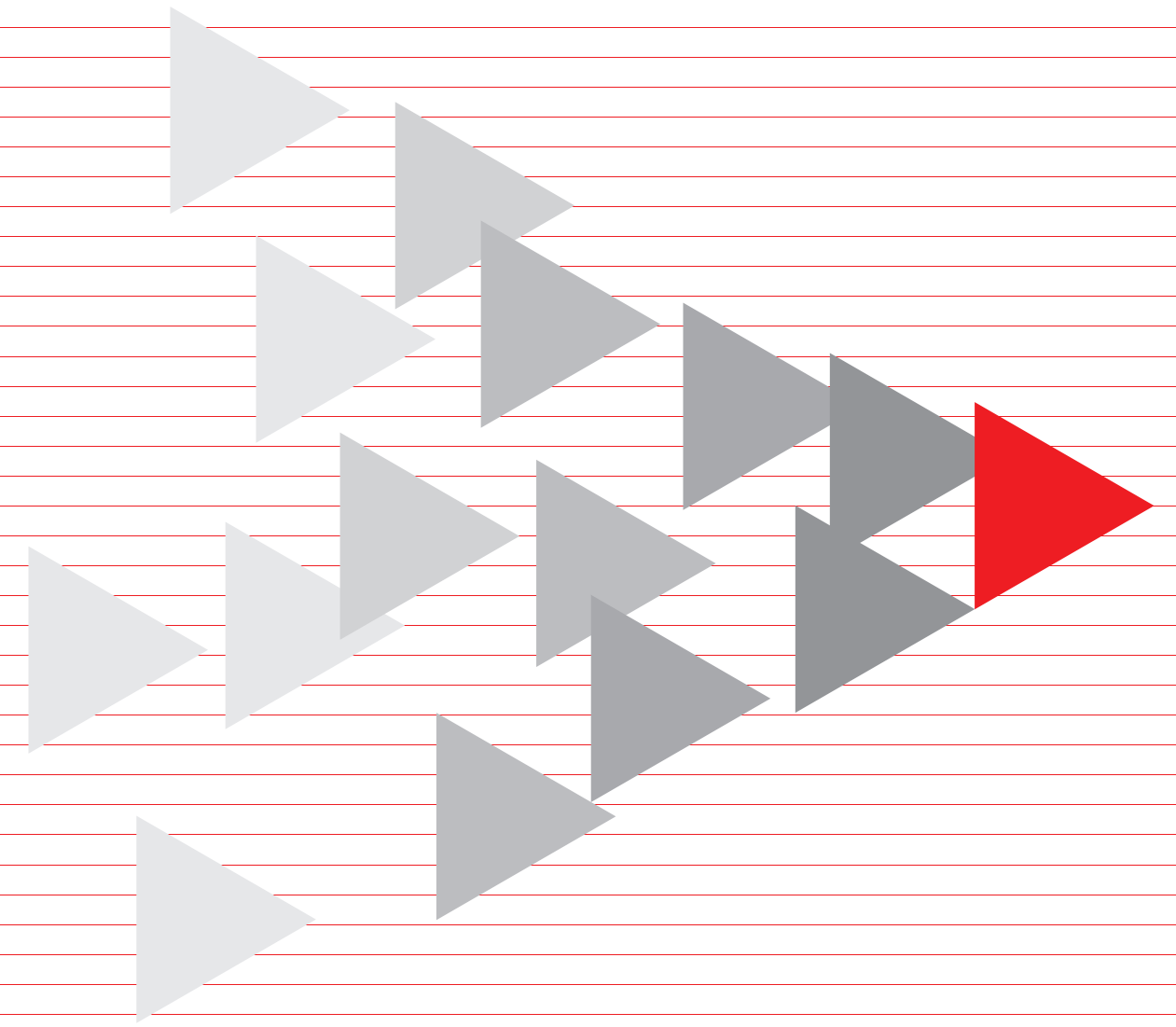

FILIP PAPICH IS A CAREER FINANCE PROFESSIONAL WITH A PASSION FOR LEADERSHIP. AN ACTIVE VOLUNTEER, HE SITS ON THE BOARDS OF SEVERAL CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS AND IS CHAIR OF THE FACULTY OF ENGINEERING ADVANCEMENT BOARD.

Filip (Fil) Papich is Managing Director & Co-Head of Bank of Montreal (BMO) Capital Markets business in Quebec and responsible for trading products activities for BMO in Montreal. He acts as a relationship manager for institutional accounts and large corporations.

Fil has strong family ties to McGill University, with three generations of his family having earned or studying their degrees there: his father, wife, and sister are all alumni, as well as his eldest son (another son will graduate this spring). As a student, Fil was very active in faculty life and was EUS President, and as an alumnus he was a leader at organizing his class reunion. Currently, he is helping the Faculty shape its Empower program, which will help guide students to develop their own leadership skills.

Fil started his career in the banking industry in 1987 and has worked in Toronto, New York, London, and Montreal. By early 2000, Fil transferred to Montréal to manage the Trading Products business for BMO Québec, servicing Québec and Eastern Canada. In addition, from 2006 to 2015, Fil created and led the Trading Products Institutional Relationship Management Team.

In March of 2015, Fil was appointed Co-Head, Global Trade and Banking where he was jointly responsible for managing the combined domestic commercial trade and international banking sales team, the specialized team responsible for establishing and maintaining credit lines to foreign countries and counterparties, and product management.

Fil is actively involved in the community, with particular interest in education and health. In addition to chairing the Faculty of Engineering Advancement Board, he is also a board member of the Veritas Fund (Selwyn House). Fil has served as a board member in the following organizations: Selwyn House School, Hillside Tennis Club, Investment Industry Association of Canada (Chair-Quebec), BMO Capital Markets Diversity Council (Chair), St Mary's Hospital Foundation Board, Bankers Association for Finance & Trade. He has a Bachelor of Engineering (Mechanical) degree from McGill University and an MBA from the Ivey Business School at the University of Western Ontario.
