

International experiences

Exchange (Fall/Winter term)

Exchange means to study at one of McGill's partner universities while earning credit at McGill and paying tuition to McGill.

Am I Eligible to Apply?

- Be currently registered as a full-time, Engineering degree-seeking McGill student
- Have a minimum CGPA 3.0
- Completed at least one year of full-time study by the start of your term abroad at least 24 graded credits.
- You can still go on exchange in your graduating term (after discussing this with departmental advisor and MESC) but be aware that will most likely delay your graduation if you are not concerned with delaying graduation you can apply. You cannot only take extra courses during this term.
- If you have been approved to write a deferred exam during your exchange term away please meet with an academic advisor immediately to go over your options as this may impact your eligibility to go on exchange.
- <u>Tip!</u> Check in with your departmental advisor before applying to discuss any course restrictions or the best time to go on exchange for your program.

Where Can I Go on Exchange?

Search all exchange options via the Study Abroad website - you can only choose schools that are coded as "Engineering" or "Open to all faculties"

Considerations for Host School Selections

- Review the full list of schools on the <u>McGill Abroad website</u> note you can only choose schools that are coded as "Open to all faculties" or "Engineering"
- It is important to do thorough research on the schools you are considering in terms of Accreditation Units (AU), programs/courses offered and language of study – be sure to review existing course equivalencies (CES) in the Course Equivalency Database to get a sense of which courses you might be able to take.
- Keep in mind the CES is not a sure representation of the courses you can take on exchange it is a growing database just to used as base.
- Not all schools offer the courses you need and may not meet our accreditation requirements and therefore, you may be required to take additional courses to satisfy the accreditation requirements. Pay attention to the special requirements in the fact sheets of the exchange University.
- Student Experience Reports are available on the <u>McGill abroad website</u> by selecting the school that you
 want to view
- Work with your departmental advisor to determine the term which works best for your curriculum and confirm if there are any course restrictions.

Application Dates & Deadlines

<u>Application Periods for 2024/2025</u>: You may apply through MINERVA during the relevant application period:

TERM	Application Periods
Fall 2024 (includes <u>full</u> year applications*)	December 5 th 2023 to January 15 th 2024
Winter 2025	(TBA)

Application Process

- You can only submit one application which can include 4 university choices there is a <u>\$150 non-refundable fee</u> that will be charged to your student account.

• <u>Application</u>:

- It is VERY important to do some personal research on the different schools.
- \checkmark Fill out the application form on Minerva.
- \checkmark Complete the statement of purpose outlining the reasons for requesting an exchange.
- Select up to for 4 host institutions (Important: Do research on their programs and courses to make sure the selected universities are a good fit for you!)
- ✓ Add a <u>tentative</u> course selection (Important: Make sure the courses that you need to progress in your curriculum are offered in the term you would like to study abroad)



There are 3 levels of decisions that will be made on MINERVA:

1. <u>The departmental level</u> will review your school choices and proposed course list to assess if your choices are suitable. – Their decisions are made by the after the January 15th deadline for Fall 2024.

2. <u>The Faculty level</u> will provide a second review to confirm the department's decision in allowing you to participate in an exchange.

3.**<u>The department and faculty are only approving the concept of you studying abroad- we do NOT approve</u> which school nor term you will be selected for.

3.FINAL APPROVAL AND NOMINATIONS: <u>The Exchange Office/Service Point</u> will start the process of nominating students to a specific school, destination and term – decisions will be sent from the exchange office (end of July/beginning of August).

It is important to note that if you do not get nominated to any of your choices, you will be sent a list of alternative options.

Nominations


- <u>Accepting/declining nominations</u>: The Exchange Office will usually allow a week for you to make a final decision on their offer of nomination.
- Following your decision, you will be sent communication and instructions via email (also listed in the comments section on MINERVA).
- Host application instructions are given to you via myCourses between February and May for Fall/full year and August to November for Winter only - this will depend on host application deadlines!

Will I Obtain Transfer Credits

• All Engineering students **must** select their courses and obtain approval after receiving their nomination but <u>prior to leaving on exchange</u>.



- Some departments/schools have course restrictions; therefore, it is extremely important to check with your department before beginning the process of selecting courses.

- All nominated students will receive more detailed instructions.

Is Financial Assistance Available?

For each term you are on exchange you will be paying 15 McGill credits; regardless of how many courses you take.

To offset some study abroad costs, you may be eligible for financial assistance:

- Students are eligible to apply for government student assistance.
- Students may also apply to the Scholarships and Student Aid Office for further assistance.
- Holders of renewable scholarships and awards may retain their awards. Renewal of entrance awards will be contingent on performance at the host institution.



Funding Opportunities

- Mobility Bursary for Exchanges (<u>https://www.mcgill.ca/studentaid/special-funding/mobility-exchanges</u>)
- Killam Awards (Awards for study in the U.S.A.)(<u>www.mcgill.ca/mcgillabroad/goabroad/funding</u>)
- Antje Graupe Pryor International Awards (\$7,500/term) are awarded to Engineering students (excluding architecture) who plan to study in universities in the European Union (preferably Germany or France). Further preference will be given to students who attend the Technical University of Berlin. <u>Antje Graupe Pryor</u> International Awards in Engineering | Graupe Awards McGill University
- McCall MacBain International Fellowship (up to \$24,000): these fellowships enable undergraduate students to spend a year abroad studying a foreign language, doing an academic exchange, and pursuing an internship. <u>http://www.mccallmacbain.org/mmif/</u> (application deadline: usually in January)
- Canada Learning Initiative in China (CLIC): funding available for students going to Chinese exchange partners (Funding | McGill Abroad Funding for McGill students going abroad McGill University

Reminder: Important Steps and Deadlines

- Access the application form on Minerva: December 5th to January 15th 2024 to apply for a Fall 2024 exchange.
- Talk to your department if they have restrictions regarding the types of courses that they allow you to take while on exchange!
- Complete the statement of purpose outlining the reasons for requesting an exchange.
- List the courses that you are proposing to take (these will need to be confirmed and approved at a later date). Please do not ask your department to pre-approve each course until your application has been accepted.
- **Provide Proof of Proficiency** (as applicable) in the language of the host institution to Service Point.
- Decisions will be sent by the Exchange Office/Service Point at the end of January Fall 2024 applications.
- An email notification will advise you to accept or decline your nomination.
- Once you have accepted the nomination, you will be given instructions on how to get official course approvals.
- Instructions on how to apply to the host institutions will be available through myCourses.

Alternative Study Abroad Options:

- Independent Study Away: Take non-Engineering courses abroad during the summer term: <u>Study Away | Faculty of Engineering -</u> <u>McGill University</u>
- SURE International Summer Undergraduate Research in Engineering (International): Participate in a research activity abroad during the summer term and apply for a SURE International Travel Stipend: <u>Research</u> <u>Internationally | Faculty of Engineering -</u> <u>McGill University</u> (applications open in March)
