Five years after the passing of Tom Routledge (1937-2011, BEng'66), and 50 years since his graduation, his friends and family came together to celebrate his impactful life.

Once dubbed the "Anarchist Editor of [student newspaper]
Plumber's Pot" – for his socially progressive political opinions, Tom
graduated in Mechanical Engineering from McGill in 1966. He began
his career in the fledgling systems industry with IBM, eventually
applying information technology to industries around the world.

Tom had many interests, from 18th Century literature to modern political events in Chile. For his involvement in Chilean business and social justice initiatives, the Chilean government awarded him their highest civilian Honour: The Order of Bernardo O'Higgins.
