Successful completion of EPIB 601, PPHS 602, and EPIB 603 at McGill or equivalent courses at another university. Excellent understanding of epidemiologic analysis and concepts. Comfort and strong familiarity with R software. Good interpersonal and communication skills. Familiarity with the delivery of online Zoom presentations.
