Position Summary:
The primary role of teaching assistants within the course is to facilitate student learning by assessing, providing feedback, and answering student questions on their three assignments that build into a research proposal. Teaching assistants will be required to attend some classes (approximately 2-4 per term) when in class support is needed to facilitate discussion and class activities. Teaching assistants will be asked to answer student emails and offer office hours to students via appointment.
Qualifications:
Teaching assistants should have a background in research methods (e.g., at minimum an undergraduate research methods course or research experience, a graduate research methods course is preferred). The course covers quantitative, qualitative, and mixed methods research approaches. However it is not necessary for a teaching assistant to have a background in all of these approaches (e.g., they may have expertise in qualitative or quantitative research approaches though expertise in qualitative research will be a strong asset). Teaching assistants should have a strong background in public health equity. Teaching assistants will evaluate student assessments by using a rubric provided by the instructor and all members of the teaching team will go over grading expectations and grade a few assignments together to ensure all are comfortable with the evaluation and feedback process. Please note that Teaching Assistants will be required on campus to perform their tasks in person.
How to Apply
<i>To be eligible for a Teaching Assistant position you must be registered at McGill University as a Graduate Student in the term to which you are applying.</i> <i>McGill student not currently employed at McGill University, must apply via external postings. The website will direct you to create a Workday account. Please note, you must use a personal email address when creating this account. Do not use @mail.mcgill.ca or @mcgill.ca email addresses.</i> <i>Candidates who are current McGill employees receiving a salary (not a graduate student stipend) must apply through their already active Workday account.</i>
