The MScPH is a full-time, two year program. It includes 48 credits of course work and a 12 credit practicum.

Who Should Apply?

We welcome candidates from diverse backgrounds with an interest in health research and with strong conceptual, analytic, and quantitative skills at the undergraduate level.

Students must have a good knowledge of differential and integral calculus, or other university-level mathematics or statistics training.

The admissions committee may take professional experience into account.

Our students come from social sciences (e.g. sociology, economics, geography), natural and quantitative sciences (e.g. biology, physiology, pharmacology, statistics), or the health professions.



Gain Real Life Experience

The mandatory practicum project allows students to apply what they have learned in the classroom in a supervised practice or research setting. Students contribute to an organization's mandate, and address a public health problem of interest to them as they develop skills as public health practitioners or researchers. These full time placements take place during the summer semester, after the first year of course work. Practicums are available in Quebec, Canada and internationally.

During the practicum experience, our students:

- Develop interpersonal, professional and communication skills.
- Build Public Health Core Competencies.
- Grow their network of professional contacts for mentorship and job searches.

A World of Opportunity

McGill MScPH students have a presence around the world. Global Health practica are available and more learning opportunities exist within the School of Population and Global Health.

Students may also apply to do a semester exchange with the University of Melbourne, in Australia.
